

All of the ceremonials were truly outstanding in every aspect! We had the pleasure of participating and working with other affiliate bodies of our Masonic family to include the Grand Lodge Officers. The unity between all is great!

Here is a short recap of some

of the 2017 Sudan events and highlights.

PATIENTS: We had another significant increase in new patients being treated at our hospitals. One newly born baby with "club feet" less than three weeks old received its first treatment. Sudan had the largest turnout of nobles, ladies and guests for "Hospital Days" at the Greenville Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville in March 2017. NOTICE

The Annual Session of Sudan Shriners will be held in the Shrine Auditorium New Bern, NC January 27, 2018

For the election of Potentate, Divan Officers, Trustees, Imperial Council Representatives, SASA Representatives and New Candidates: the 2018 Budget Approval, and the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the temple.

Imperial Bylaws Article 325.11: Election Regulations

- (a) Electioneering. A candidate for an elected office in a Shrine temple may print, publish and circulate during the year he is seeking the elected office, a resume' consisting of his educational background, his vocational history, and his Masonic and Shrine record. Except as provided in the prior sentence, the printing, publication, circulating or distribution of resolutions, letters, telegrams, tickets, email or other devices, by a unit, club, noble, or group of nobles, suggesting, recommending, opposing, or containing the names of proposed candidates for office in the temple is prohibited.
- (b) **Expenditures Prohibited.** The expenditure of money for gifts, favors, or entertainment on behalf of a candidate for elected office is prohibited.
- (c) Violation. For any violation of (a) or (b), the Imperial Potentate may suspend any offending noble, and he may declare the election of the officers void and order a new election.
- (d) Notice. At least one week prior to the annual meeting or any election, the temple Recorder shall mail to each member a notice thereof containing this section.

The Story Behind the Shoe



Chance Laugginger



My name is Chance Laugginger. I was born on July 2, 1994 to Carol and Harald Laugginger. I was born in Virginia Beach, Virginia. Currently, I reside in Moyock, North Carolina with my father. I am a Graduate of Currituck County High School class of 2012. After graduating High School, I went on to earn my Associates of Arts Degree from College Of The Albemarle located in Elizabeth City, North

Carolina. I am currently attending Elizabeth City State University, working towards my Bachelor's Degree in Business Administration with a concentration in Economics and Finance. I will graduate May 12, 2018.

I was raised a Master Mason by my father, Harald Laugginger on April 10, 2013 at Hall Lodge # 53, AF & AM. On May 4, 2013 I joined Sudan Shriners in New Bern, NC. Shortly After, I became a member of The Elizabeth City Shrine Club, and the Sudan Buccaneers. I am currently serving as Vice President until the end of 2017.

I have been asked this question many of times. Why did you become a Shriner? The answer for me is easy. I became a Shriner to support an amazing network of hospitals that deliver the best care to children at no cost to their families. I joined to give back after what The Shriners Hospitals for Children have done for me. For those of you who do not know, I was a patient of Shriners Hospital from November 6, 2004 to February 14, 2005.

On November 6, 2004 I was on a weekend camping trip with my mother. Our family had a camper at a local campground 30 minutes from where we lived. On that day I remember waking up to the sound of a fire alarm. As I opened my eyes, I saw flames coming towards my bedroom. The camper was completely engulfed. I immediately jumped from my bed and had to figure out a way to escape. I didn't have any other options at this point. I ended up running through the flames, and finding my way out of the door.

Once I was outside, I ran next door to my grandmother's camper. Her door was unlocked, I took off all my burning clothes, turned the faucet on, and put my clothes in the sink. During that moment, my mom ran inside and turned on the lights began to cover me with blankets. I remember standing there in shock shivering. The paramedics arrived 30 minutes later and took me to the local airport. From there I was airlifted to Sentara Norfolk General Hospital, and then transferred to The Children's Hospital of the Kings Daughters.

After I was stabilized, my dad rushed to the hospital to be by my side. The doctor's diagnosis wasn't looking good. They said I sustained 2nd and 3rd degree burns to 75% of my body and didn't know if I was going to survive. They said my only hope would be The Shriners Hospital for Children. The closest burns hospital was in Cincinnati, Ohio. Both of my parents agreed to send me there.

Within a few hours, a Lear Jet was landing at Norfolk International Airport and I was being flown to Cincinnati with my dad next to me. Upon my arrival, my dad met with the Chief of Staff Dr. Richard Kagan to discuss the severity of my injuries and the plan of action to take. I ended up being burned 60% of my body. On November 8, 2004

I was set for my first surgery. From there, I went on to receive 20 more surgeries to repair all of the damage.

For 3.5 months The Shriners Hospital for Children was my second home. All of the staff held the highest standard of medical care and cleanliness. The nurses and doctors made me feel important. Anything that I needed, they found a way for me to have it. I wasn't confined to a bed 24/7. I socialized with the other patients participating in fun activities, video games, and the occasional family outing out on the town.

This traumatic experience even inspired my dad to become a Shriner. And when I was 18 I followed behind his footsteps for the same reason. For those of you that have never visited one of our hospitals. I encourage you to do so, to see what all of our hard work does for all these children. It gives me pride to wear my Fez, because I personally understand the positive impact we have on every child and family we help.

Chris Varga



My name is Chris Varga, and I'm currently the President of the Elizabeth City Shrine Club, member of the Sudan Buccaneers, and a proud Mason. I was born in Spokane, WA in the summer of 1976. You might wonder how I came to live in North Carolina. Well, I have lived in many beautiful places but once my family and I moved here back in 2004, we decided that this is the place we want the kids to grow up. Now that you know where I ended up, let me share the story of how I ended up here.

I was born a healthy baby boy. My parents say I would never sit still and was always bouncing off the walls. Well, all that changed on October 20th, 1980. I snuck out of the house that night to go to my friend's house. Mind you I was only 4 years old and had no business being outside by myself at night. I was also thick-headed. My friend lived across a busy street that was 4 lanes wide. I didn't even make it across two lanes before being hit by a 17-year-old kid that was speeding past a semi at 65 mph.

I woke up two weeks later to find my left leg was hanging down from a bar above the bed with a pin through the knee. Yes, you heard that right, I was in a coma for two weeks while the doctors and my body worked at healing me. I had broken every bone in my body except for two ribs. Many of them were broken in multiple spots. They say that I was very lucky that a surgeon had been walking by the dispatch when the call came in that a 4-year-old had been hit by a car and decided to jump in the ambulance so that he could start working with me immediately at the site of the accident.

Too say I was in bad shape would be a gross understatement. It was a couple of days after I had woken up that the doctors told me the news that I would probably never walk again. There was some nerve damage in the lower part of my neck. Basically, after I had been rocked by a car at 65 mph the doctors hit me with a sledge hammer that took the breath out me. I had only been walking for a few years and now you tell me I'll never do it again.

I left the hospital a few months later in a full body cast, which I wore for another six months. They had to rebreak my leg twice before it healed properly. Once I was free of the cast, I went to physical therapy 3 times a week. My mother also worked with me every day, because she was not about to listen to the doctors and give up on the thought of me making a full recovery. When my dad was done working he'd join in on helping me with my exercises. My parents were not wealthy by any means, the doctor bills were piling up, and the kid that hit me was underinsured so we were only able to get a small settlement from the insurance company. Then my parents were introduced to the Shriner's and the Children's Hospital in Spokane, WA.

Over the next 13 years I had over 10 surgeries done at the Shriners Children's Hospital. And yes, because of the Shriner's, by the time I was 8 years old I was walking without the help of a walker or crutches. I was even crowned the king at one of the Shrine Bowls. I have so many good memories with the Shriner's Hospital. For many of the surgeries I was there for many days and during that time I met so many friends. The hospital had game rooms, movie nights, and even people to help you with your homework. They not only helped me be able to walk again but gave me the confidence that I could do anything I set my mind to.

Now 37 years later, I am President of my local Shrine Club. I have a beautiful wife and 3 amazing kids with my youngest just turning 18. I own a software company which allows me the means to give back to the one organization that has done so much for me and my family. It gives me immense pride when I put on my Red Fez, because I personally understand the impact that we have on every family and child that we help.

Allison Mills



In May 2017, our world changed in the blink of an eye when our perfectly healthy, happy-go-lucky 17-month old daughter, Allison, suddenly became paralyzed from her neck down. Her initial diagnosis—a spinal cord stroke—was very grim. The doctors at our local research hospital left us little hope for Allison's recovery. We were devastated, but we placed our trust in the Lord for Allison's healing.

We searched tirelessly for second opinions and found that Boston Children's Hospital (BCH) has treated

several children with Allison's condition. Thanks to God's perfect intervention, we were moved to BCH on June 2. BCH determined that Allison's condition was not a stroke of the spine (a nearly hopeless outcome), but was due to unknown spinal cord trauma and was treatable! Through much prayer and treatments such as steroids, IVIG, and plasma pharesis, Allison began to show movement in her hands and arms. While at BCH, she also received a g-tube for nutrition and medication and a tracheostomy for ventilation.

Once BCH had done all they could, we were given two recommendations for the best pediatric spinal cord rehabilitation programs. Since we have family connections with the Shriners (and for other reasons), we selected Shriner's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia. Insurance initially denied our transportation to from Boston to Philadelphia, but Shriner's stepped up and paid for the transport so we wouldn't lose momentum with Allison's recovery.

Once we arrived in Philadelphia on July 18, we met Allison's amazing team of doctors, therapists, and nurses at Shriner's. She had

4-5 hours of therapy every day; she was quickly, but safely weaned off of the ventilation; and our hungry little fighter began eating solid foods again. And, praise God, she showed movement in her legs for the first time since May! We cannot say enough about the staff and the care we received in Philadelphia. From Allison's treatments to making sure the adults were as comfortable and well-informed as possible, it was such a blessing and a true community effort.

Allison went home on August 29, where we continue her therapies locally and visit the Shriner's Hospital for Children in Greenville, SC, once a year to monitor her progress. We cannot thank the Shriners' enough for all of the love and support they have shown and continue to show to our family. Allison will soon be 2 years old, and thanks to the Shriners Hospital, we will be able to celebrate Christmas and her second birthday at home!

Stephen's story:



Stephen was born on December 27, 1990. At his 9 month checkup, I addressed with his doctor my concerns. Stephen was referred to a pediatric specialist, and then we were transferred to Chapel Hill. When we met with the doctor, he told us "Your son has Cerebral Palsy and you will need to mentally and financially prepare yourselves, that your son will never walk. He will be confined to a wheel chair." We were also told he would not have a lot of mobility on his left side. We got a second opinion from Duke and the results were the same.

Stephen's name was given to the Johnston County Shrine Club. Our first trip to the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, S.C. in May 1992. It was a very emotional journey that I questioned a lot. In 1995, Stephen lost his father in a motorcycle accident. From that moment on we never questioned God's plan again. Stephen didn't know a life without casts, hand or leg braces until 1999. In 1999, Stephen's first surgery lasted over 15 ½ hours long. Stephen was in a body cast for 6 weeks. Once the body cast was removed, he was placed in different cast for a period of 16 weeks and leg mobilizers. Stephen went thru weeks of physical therapy to learn how to walk again. When Stephen got older we were given the option of hand surgery. We were asked to do videos of the mobility of his hand before and after to share with other patients. In late 2009, Stephen was released as a patient of the Shriner's Hospital.

For Stephen's high school senior project in 2010, he did a fundraiser to raise money for the Shriners Hospitals. The fundraiser consisted of a cake auction, donations and Al Batten and the Bluegrass Reunion for entertainment. Stephen wanted to give back to those that had given him so much. His fundraiser raised almost \$6000.

In 2014, our lives became full circle. Stephen's step dad, TJ Johnson became a Shriner. TJ is a member of the Dunn Shrine Club and is also a member of the Sudan Dunn Clowns (Tank). We are very thankful to be a part of an organization so rewarding and to give back to those that gave Stephen and I so much.

Stephen and I will always be thankful for the doctors and staff at the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville S.C., and all the Shrine Units. We are grateful for all the love and support from the Johnston County Shrine Unit who became our second family.

One of a Million Thanks



Forty six years ago in 1972, I was born with a very serious birth defect. At about one month of age on a Sunday night I began having severe diarrhea. While examining me he found that I had a lump in my intestines. The General Practitioner, first thought it was a tumor of some kind. I was sent straight to the Children's Hospital ER in the Norfolk Virginia area and they began running tests. The next morning they took a biopsy on me and I was diagnosed with Hirschsprung's Disease. The doctor informed my mom that I would need several surgeries to correct this deformity. He also stated that most of this would be extremely difficult on such a small child and for only until recently had they learned enough about this disease to begin a successful treatment. Had I been born a few years earlier I would have died of unknown causes

During this stressful time, my mom began to worry about how they would pay for my medical needs, since they were so young and my dad was not making much money. She mentioned her concerns to the doctor. He told her about a program the called the Crippled Children's Fund from the Shriners Crippled Children's Hospitals, that was very interested in research and development about this disorder and that they would send someone to discuss this with her. The doctor did not want to perform this surgery on such a small child. He explained to my mom that babies with Hirschsprung's Disease usually did not gain weight quickly therefore they expected me to be approximately eighteen to twenty-four months of age before I would be big enough for this surgery. At only six months of age I weighed 16 pounds and my mother immediately requested that I have the surgery.

Dr. George Harkins was one of the leading pediatric surgeons in the world and he suggested that they wait a little longer since I was still so young. At eight months of age, I gained more weight and was admitted to the hospital for the corrective surgeries. The morning I went to surgery I weighed exactly twenty pounds. At nine months of age, six surgeries and 1500 stitches later I finally went home from the hospital for good.

Every cent was covered by the "Crippled Children's Fund", even the dollar per night for the cot that my mom slept on. We were also never charged for one single office visit over the years. Every time I went to see the surgeon he was always very loving and kind. He was also very interested in me and very proud of all the sports I participated in over the years.

One time my mom mentioned to him about his helping us to get hooked up with the "Crippled Children's Fund" that paid for my surgeries and hospital bills but he said he did not know what she was talking about and he had nothing to do with that, but he was in fact a Shriner and I now know otherwise. Dr. George Harkins was one of the most loving and kind person I have ever met. I have always been very thankful that he played such a role in my life. Without him, chances are that I would not be here today. I am also thankful that he helped to open my heart, mind and eyes in the many ways to help other people.

I remember one time, I was about 12 years old and there were several interns coming from Mexico for training and Dr. H called my mom because he wanted her to bring me in and show the interns what he had done as a training aid. He acted so proud and told them all about me and my life as well as the surgeries I had undergone.

Thanks to Dr. George Harkins I am now Past President, Past Director of Dare County Shrine Club, Past Master of Manteo 521 and the District Deputy Grand Lecturer of the Second District. As a living ambassador for Shriners Hospitals, I would like to have the chance to thank my doctor again for all he did for my family and me but he has since passed away.

I am a Shriner today because of what so many Shriners before me have done for so many children and their families. I have been one of those crippled children who have overcome so many obstacles with the help of the Shrinedom. Now that I am on the other side of the fence I want to encourage both child and Shriner to give and live every day to their maximum potential. There will certainly be even more need tomorrow than today. Here it is forty six years after the first surgery, when I had such little chance of surviving, and I still get so excited to ride my unicycle on parade day so I am able say today that "I ride on one wheel so that crippled children may walk"

Without each and every individual Shriner and Mason, I would not be the citizen that I am today. It's amazing to me how the generosity of others can turn such an overwhelming adverse situation into an asset. This life changing event for me and nearly one million children like myself gives me the opportunity to say "Thanks a Million"!!!

According to the National Bullying Prevention Center, bullying can cause depression, anxiety and other health problems, as well as poor academic performance. Public service announcements, a social media challenge, tip cards and an anti-bullying ambassador tool kit can help kids and adults #SeeTheAbility in all people.

"Growing up, my disability made me a target for bullies," said Mitte, who has cerebral palsy. "I was harassed, knocked down and even had my hand broken. Now, I have an opportunity to give a voice to people with disabilities and promote acceptance."

Like Mitte, many Shriners Hospitals patients have scars or physical differences that put them at greater risk for being bullied. As part of their ongoing care plans, staff at Shriners Hospitals across the nation offer various empowerment programs to help patients succeed socially and emotionally.

Shriners Hospitals for Children provides specialty pediatric care for children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families' ability to pay. Shriners Hospitals also offers psychological support, rehabilitation, life skills training and community outreach programs that help children with physical differences feel confident.

"Our goal is to help our patients succeed and reach beyond the traditional limits of their conditions," said Gary Bergenske, chairman of the Board of Directors at Shriners Hospitals for Children. "We do this at Shriners Hospitals every day. This campaign gives us a chance to reach outside our hospitals to help all people see beyond physical appearances to the ability that lies within each child."
