

#### Jerry Reginald Tillett



Jerry Reginald Tillett was born on December 22, 1957, in Elizabeth City, NC to Willett R. Tillett and Jeanine D. Tillett. Jerry attended public schools in Manteo, participating in sports and other extra-curricular activities. He graduated from Wake Forest University with high honors. He was awarded the Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from Wake Forest University School of Law, receiving numerous academic awards.

Jerry's father, Willett Tillett, was active in Masonic work and was serving as senior grand warden at the time of his death. Jerry and his wife, the former Tanya Umphlett, have two children, Jeremy and Ara.

After a brief period of work with a large firm in Winston-Salem, Tillett returned home to become a partner in the firm of Merrell, Tillett and Barnes. He engaged in general practice of law until 1992. He then served as legal counsel and Chief of Staff to the NC General Assembly President Pro Tempore Marc Basnight. In 1993, he was appointed special Superior Court Judge. In May 1994, he returned home with an appointment as resident Superior Court Judge and has since been elected resident Superior Court multiple times, serving for over twenty one years. He continues to serve the people of our state as Senior Resident Superior Court Judge.

Jerry Tillett is an active member of his community and attends Manteo Assembly of God Church. He is a member of the American and North Carolina bar associations; has served on numerous committees of the North Carolina Legislature, and chairs or serves on committees of the Conference of Superior Court Judges, and as a member of the College of the Albemarle Board of Trustees and the State Employees Credit Union Advisory Board, the Dare County Tourism Board and Farm Bureau Board. He has been a member of the Lions Club and numerous other organizations.

Tillett was raised a Master Mason on June 28, 1982, Manteo 521 and served as 521's master in 1989. He is a member of Sudan Shriners, Royal Order of Jesters, member and past president of Dare County Shrine Club, elected Knights Court of Honor and was coroneted an Inspector General Honorary 33 degree of the Supreme Council of the Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction. He is a member of the Allied York Rite Bodies and National Sojourners. He is a member and past Director of Beach Bums parade unit. In 2007, Jerry was appointed by Ill. Sir Wayne Edwards, as Outer Guard and progressed through the offices until being elected Potentate of Sudan Shriners in January, 2015.

He was appointed as junior grand steward in 1995 progressed through the offices until being elected Grand Master of Masons in 2001-2002. In 2007, Tillett was awarded the Joseph Montfort medal, the highest award from the NC Grand Lodge.

The Sudan Widows Fund receives services from a variety of unpaid volunteers. No amounts have been recognized in the accompanying statement of activities because the criteria for recognition of such volunteer effort under SFAS No. 116 have not been satisfied.

#### NOTE E--CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

Sudan Widows Fund maintains cash and investments at banks and other financial institutions that are FDIC insured. At December 31, 2014 balances exceeded FDIC insured limits by \$9,211.

#### NOTE F--SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

The Sudan Widows Fund has evaluated events and transactions for subsequent events that would impact the financial standing for the year ended December 31, 2014 through January 20, 2015, the date the financial statements were available to be issued. 



#### **USING LASERTECHNOLOGY**

One advancement in scar treatment is the use of lasers. Laser therapy was previously used only to treat congenital birthmarks such as port wine stains and hemangiomas, however research revealed that laser therapy can be effective for burn scars. Surgeons at Cincinnati Shriners Hospital have used the laser to minimize scar thickness, change the color and appearance of old scars, reduce the color of new scars, eliminate both light and dark hair growth, and more.

#### **RESEARCH TO FIND A SOLUTION**

Researchers at Shriners Hospitals for Children—Cincinnati continue to investigate how keloid scars form. Keloids are thick, raised scars resulting from an excess growth of scar tissue at the site of a healed skin injury. The cause is unknown.


Dorothy Supp, Ph.D., associate investigator at Cincinnati Shriners Hospital has been studying keloids for five years. Dr. Supp's laboratory studies cells from keloids and analyzes the tissue to obtain genetic information to better understand what starts the process of keloid formation so better, more effective treatments can be developed.
