

#### Potentate's Message



Nobles and Ladies,

Many Nobles and their families have experienced major damage to their homes and businesses while today are trying to get their lives back to normal as possible. Our office received major destruction with over four feet of water on the ground floor resulting in a loss of computers, phones, supplies and furniture. We also had many windows blown out as well as severe roof leakage. Fortunately while preparing for the storm we were able to back up our computers and secure many documents. We are working daily with our insurance carrier and have professional storm mitigation teams working at the property. This week we rented an office for our staff and have ordered a new phone system, replacement computers and furniture. Hopefully, we will be back in operation very shortly. Please continue to pray for the families that have been affected by this massive and destructive hurricane.

Oxford Homecoming is scheduled for Saturday, October 13th and we hope for a good turnout from our nobility. The parade steps off at 11am on a shorter route than in the past and will be followed by the Barbeque luncheon that is prepared by our Masonic Teams. Immediately following will be a free concert....please try to come and spend some time in Oxford.

The Fall Ceremony will be held in Wilson on November 16, 17 and we encourage everyone to attend. Hotel sign-ups will be forwarded to you shortly due to our computers being lost by the hurricane. The Nobles and Ladies have been working very hard to make this an enjoyable and fun weekend for everyone.

Please continue to support our fundraisers and remember we will be drawing for the golf cart and cash giveaway at the Fall Ceremony.

As 2018 is drawing to a close I would like to thank everyone for their dedication and hard work by making Sudan Shriners who we are. Let's always remember our philanthropy and why we do what we do....supporting Shriners Hospitals for Children.



TO: Sudan Shriner's Membership

On September 19, 2018 we reported to all Nobles with email addresses a brief update of the damages and situation at your Sudan Temple from Hurricane Florence. The damages assessed at this time indicate a long term displacement of our office operations. Therefore, we have obtained a temporary office to establish and work our Sudan office and activities.

Several clubs, units and members have wanted to volunteer to help clean up. The ground floor had nearly four feet of water. Due to the destruction and damages, cleanup and restoration of the temple is being completed by contracted professionals who have experience and training to complete the job. Basically, the bottom floor has been gutted. All services (electrical, water, phone etc.) have been discontinued and will not be restored any time soon. The temple is still off limits to all.

The hard drives from the computers were located and the data stored on two of our office hard drives have been retrieved. Hopefully we will have internet and phone services established soon. Our email addresses and phone numbers will remain the same.

Our Area Governors and Divan members are attempting to identify clubs, units and membership who may have suffered losses. Please help us with this effort as we want to make a good report to those agencies that may be able to assist and provide relief. The Masonic Services Association (MSA) has announced a Disaster Relief Appeal for the Grand Lodge of North Carolina. The Most Worshipful Grand Master of Masons in North Carolina is heavily involved in these efforts. Donations to MSA are tax deductible.

We have received inquiries about donations to help with the costs of recovery. We do have insurance for our facilities and property but it will not cover all our losses.

Our new mailing address is contained in the new letterhead of this letter. Please send all mail or correspondence to the new address listed above. The US Postal Services will forward mail from our old address. Our temporary offices are located at 1425 S Glenburnie Road, Suite 4, New Bern, NC 28562. Mailing address is listed in this letterhead.

#### Kennedy



Kennedy was three and a half when we adopted her from China. When we got her she was referred to a pediatric orthotic surgeon at Duke where they diagnosed her with arthrogryposis and told us Kennedy was facing multiple orthopedic surgeries of her hips, legs and feet. I felt like we needed a second opinion and we had heard of Shriners Hospitals for Children from other adoptive families. Shriners had a cancellation and was able to see

Kennedy the next week. We drove 6 hours to Greenville, SC and met Dr. Pete Stasikelis. We immediately fell in love with the entire hospital and staff. It was so child oriented from the décor to the toys and games in the waiting areas, and the way kids and family were treated like family. Dr. Pete was amazing and we felt confident with his recommendations. He said she was rare not to have been treated before the age of 4 and the whole team poured over her file to decide on a treatment plan. In 2017 she had hip and femur surgery to repair her dislocated hip that had caused her leg to stop growing. We spent three nights in the hospital and the care was all we could have asked for. She returned home in a spica cast for 6 weeks and then had 6 weeks of intensive physical therapy. At one year post op her hip had healed and her leg was beginning to catchup in growth. We are now beginning to address her vertical talus of both feet. Dr. Pete was very honest by telling that surgery is risky. If she has the surgery it could lead to debility and pain in early adulthood. If she does not, the same could happen. She had casts on both legs for 6 weeks and the casting improved the feet some but not enough to avoid the need for surgery. She will return in 6 months to reevaluate and decide upon further treatment. We are so very thankful that they have been upfront with us about the risks of each option and keeping us in the decision making process. We could not ask for a better experience with Shriners. In addition the assistance offered by Sudan Shriners has been such a blessing. Driving 6 hours for care will take its toll physically, emotionally and financially, especially when you have to do it weekly. I don't know how we could have afforded the trips if we had to pay for gas and lodging each week. Shriners Hospitals for Children and Sudan Shriners have made it possible for us to concentrate on our daughter and not how we were going to make it all happen. I tell everyone who will listen about Shriners and the blessing they have been to our family.

#### Lily Mae



This is Lily Mae! She is 3 years old and precious to us. Lily was diagnosed with Spina Bifida when she was only 20 week gestation. We had a lot to think about and prepare for. As her parents we were offered a surgery to repair her spine and untether her spinal cord in efforts to improve her condition. After much prayer and research we decided this would be her path. The surgery was very

successful and she came through it like a champ with some unanswered question as to how much function she would have. Lily was born with some physical problems like bilateral clubbed foot and neurogenic bowel and bladder problems. She has endured many procedures for foot correction and managing her other problems. Lily (like in the picture) always has a smile on her face and has such a high spirit. She faces her adversaries head on and always wants to join in with the other kids as though she sees no difference in herself. We are so thankful for the intervention of her doctors and both Shriners Hospitals for Children in Philadelphia and South Carolina and all the staff at UNC Chapel Hill that have been so dedicated to Lily's success. She attends physical therapy weekly with an amazing therapist that challenges her and for all these things we are so thankful. Lily does have some more obstacles to climb but my prayer is that she always keep her positive attitude and knows that she can be and do anything she wants in this life. She is a true blessing to her family and we love and cherish her dearly. God knew who Lily needed. But we didn't know that we also needed her!

# INCREASING OUTREACH EFFORTS

Today, our world is more and more like one large community – we can pretty much reach anyone anywhere, at any time. Our "smaller" world and the possibilities provided by modern communications technology give us a tremendous opportunity to reach many more kids in need of help, in many more places. We want to expand our efforts to improve the lives of children by providing care far beyond the walls of our hospitals and clinics, and past the borders of our traditional locations.

One way to do this is to expand our outreach programs. These efforts allow Shriners Hospitals for Children to serve a significant number of children who, otherwise, would likely never experience the special brand of hope and healing that is the hallmark of our health care system. Despite the fact that we have buildings in just three countries, we have, over time, cared for children from more than 170 countries. That is something we can all be extremely proud of, and an example of how we can serve more kids in more places.

In 2017, international outreach clinics were held in several countries, including Cyprus, the Dominican Republic, Honduras, Panama, and some of the Caribbean islands. Our physicians also worked with other relief organizations and cared for patients in additional international locations.

Our primary locations also hold outreach clinics within their local areas. For example, Shriners Hospitals for Children — Honolulu, which has the largest catchment area for outreach in our health care system and serves a geographical area at least as large as the continental United States, holds outreach clinics on its neighboring Hawaiian islands and serves the South Pacific, including Guam (their largest outreach clinic with the most patients), Tinian, Saipan, Fiji, Tonga, American Samoa, Western Samoa, the Federated States of Micronesia and the Republic of the Marshall Islands.

Overall, in 2017, our health care system held more than 400 outreach clinics.

# MAKING DECISIONS FOR THE FUTURE

After Much Discussion, Important Legislation was Passed During Imperial Session

LEGISLATION

**THE CALL FOR THE 2018** Imperial Session was very large and included a number of important substantive items. The number of health care system-related items considered was considerably more than in prior years.

Therefore, in order to reduce the amount of time required for counting votes, the lowa Representatives and Colorado Members changed the bylaws to permit electronic voting, which was used for the first time at the 2018 Imperial Session. Even though electronic voting was utilized, the votes casts by individual Representatives or Members remained secret.

#### **Health Care System Legislation**

Our commitment to serving more kids in more places while being good stewards of the funds entrusted to our care was discussed in detail. The ability and need to substantially improve the cost effectiveness of the care provided also was thoroughly explored. In addition, the role of the Joint Boards, including the importance of the Joint Board's ability to make changes in the care and delivery models of our hospitals, was explained with great clarity.

As the discussion of each of several pieces of proposed legislation took place, the voting representatives gained a greater understanding of the overall process and goals, including the fact that, while it is critically important for the Joint Boards to retain authority, these individuals work closely and extensively with executive teams and hospital leadership to both refine and implement decisions. Many proposals were withdrawn or failed to pass.

Ultimately, the health care system legislation adopted at the 2018 Imperial Session authorizes the Boards of Governors of the Twin Cities, Cincinnati and Tampa hospitals and the Boards of Directors and Trustees of Shriners Hospitals for Children to reach decisions on relocating these hospitals.

Leadership will continue to work with the Boston hospital as it moves forward with a plan to reduce space, use resources more effectively and strengthen community relationships. In addition, the Oversight Committee will continue with the Chairman of the Board of Directors of Shriners Hospitals for Children appointing the chairman and four additional members of the committee for the succeeding year.

#### **Fraternal Legislation**

A large number and variety of items were presented to the Iowa Representatives for consideration at the 2018 Imperial Session.

A number of legislative items were adopted by the lowa Representatives. The following is a listing and brief summary of some of the Fraternal legislation that was adopted:

- Charters were granted to Bolivia Shriners of Santa Cruz, Bolivia and Amal Shriners, of São Paolo, Brazil, making them the 197th and 198th Shriners temples, respectively. An international temple is required to have 300 members in order to obtain a charter.
- 2. The Imperial Potentate may now grant a special dispensation to allow more than two stated meetings of a temple during a calendar year to be held at a location other than the temple but within the exclusive or concurrent jurisdiction of the temple.
- 3. An associate member cannot concurrently hold elective offices in any other temples of which he is a member or concurrently hold elective offices in any of the clubs or units of the temples of which he is a member.
- 4. A noble who has served two years as Potentate may now serve an additional two years as Potentate if he has served at least two years subsequent to his previous term as Potentate in an office or offices on the official Divan other than as Potentate and there are no other eligible candidates offering for election to the position as Potentate.

- 5. Written objections prior to balloting on a candidate's petition are no longer allowed under an amendment passed at the 2018 Imperial Session. A majority vote is required in balloting on a candidate's petition.
- **6.** Temples supporting international development can apply for reimbursement of a portion of the expenses related to the International development under limited conditions.
- 7. In any state outside of the United States of America, Canada, Panama and Republic of Mexico regardless of whether such state currently is within the jurisdiction of a temple, dispensation could be issued upon a petition signed by one hundred and fifty (150) nobles or Master Masons qualified by these bylaws to become nobles. A temple granted dispensation under this exception would be required, within three years, to meet the requirements of at least three hundred (300) nobles prior to being eligible for a charter.
- 8. In a state other than the United States and Canada, upon the request of a Shrine Club and with the approval of the Potentate of the authorizing temple, the Imperial Potentate may appoint a designee to preside at a ceremonial session.

Imperial Sir Bergenske requested and received the cooperation of the floor in considering an extremely large volume of substantive legislation in a very short time.

While important hospital legislation was required to be considered on Thursday morning, the 2018 Imperial Session was able to adjourn before noon on Thursday.

We thank all of the voting members and representatives for their attention, dedication and diligence in making these decisions that will guide and impact the future of both Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children.




