



The \$5000.00 Cash Giveaway and Golf Cart tickets will be sold right up to the night it is drawn at our Fall Ceremonial in Dunn on November 18th.

Hospital patient numbers continue to go up which means that Shriners Hospitals for Children has made a difference in the lives of many more young children. Sudan still has over 540 children within our jurisdiction receiving the treatments and care. We recently replaced our 2006 15-passenger hospital van with a 2016 15-passenger van thanks to the hard work of many nobles and contributions to the Transportation Fund.

Hopefully we are providing more Public Relations information to your clubs and units as we receive it from the various hospitals and Shriners International. Speaking of Public Relations, we will be gearing up for the upcoming 2017 Christmas season with our units participating, pleasing the crowds and spreading the word of what we as Masons/Shriners are about and our Shriners Hospitals for Children. The 143rd Annual Session of Shriners International was held in Daytona Beach, Florida over the dates of July 9-12, 2017. Thousands of Shriners, their families and friends from around the world gathered for the purposes of conducting business and sharing brotherly love and friendship for the oldest philanthropy in the world. Imperial Sir Gary Berkenske from Bahia Shriners was elected as the Imperial Potentate for the 2017-2018 term. An action packed week with outstanding weather conditions made the session most enjoyable. There were fifty (50) items on the call for the representatives to assess and rule on. The annual parade was conducted with Sudan being represented by the always popular and famous Sudan Horse Patrol from Wilson. Another dedicated Shriner from Sudan made an outstanding effort to participate in the parade. That was Capt. Eric Pate, a noble from the Carteret County Shrine Club and Sudan Mariner. Noble Eric and his lady made the long trip to the event only to be confronted with vehicle problems on the way. He arrived late for entry into the parade and was denied participation. During the last day of formal business session, Sudan was recognized for its Red Fez Magazine, Honorable Mention in the annual Dromedary Awards competition where nearly 200 Shrine Centers compete. This was third time in five years (2013, 2015, and 2017) the Red Fez has been a winner. Three Sudan Shriners were appointed to various committees. Illustrious Sir Stacey Pugh was appointed as an Aide to the Imperial Outer Guard; PP Steve Norris was re-appointed as the Chairman for the Southeast Region 8, Membership Committee, and Recorder Emeritus Noble Benny Smith was appointed to the Imperial Potentates Aide Committee.



My daughter Serena "Grace" Chape was diagnosed with cerebral palsy when she was a year old. We were put in touch with Shriners Hospitals for Children as soon as the diagnoses was made.

Grace has moderate spastic hemiplegia cerebral palsy and it affects the left side of her body, her speech, left arm and left leg. Grace did not speak until she was five-years old and she did

not walk until she was three-years old. She was two-years old before she could sit up by herself and has had seven surgeries at Shriner Hospitals for Children and countless therapies.

I honestly do not know what we would have done without Shriner Hospital for Children. The level of care and understanding they have given her is above and beyond any other hospital I have ever been too and Grace has been seen at other Hospitals for second opinions. The physicians even referred me back to Shriner Hospital. "Action Jackson"



2007 summer vacation took Jackson and family to Po Folks in Panama City, Florida, to eat supper with his great grandfather, Bill Clanton, Past Potentate of Shaddai Shriners. Jackson reached for a sip of sweet tea from Bill's glass and upon standing, Bill proclaimed the baby's feet didn't look quite right and encouraged his mother to take him to Shriners Hospitals for Children in Green-

ville, SC.

That first evaluation was a starting point for a now tenyear journey. Jackson was in constant pain and reverted back to crawling and scooting instead of walking. Jackson wore ankle foot orthotics (AFO) for several years and Dr. Gibson, recommended surgical intervention to add the missing bone and tighten tendons. Jackson had each foot and leg corrected during a two-year period and spent 12 weeks non-weight bearing, twice. He was a master in the wheelchair and gained upper body power by scooting across the floor.

Sudan Road Runners provided transportation to and from the hospitals. When he became school age, Angel Medical Flight stepped in and flew him back and forth. He missed very little school and none of the cost was felt by his mother. All of the Shriners were very kind and took him to eat gluten free at Red Robin which was always a special treat.

Jackson is a happy young man of ten years living on the family farm and surrounded by love and support he has flourished. He enjoys driving his new go-cart and his cousins are still very much at his side. He is in fourth grade at his school in Aurora, NC where he is affectionately known as "Action Jackson".

I wasn't able to be by Omarion's side at first because I had to bury my two daughters but they kept me posted every step of the way and his privacy was protected. When it was time for me to go Sudan's Transportation vans transported me. They took good care of me and my son and I didn't have to worry about anything. Any questions I had were answered to where I understood everything. I would definitely recommend them if anyone wants the best care for their child.

As for my son, Omarion, he's back to his normal self and you can hardly tell how badly he was burned. Shriners Hospitals for Children has given him his confidence back and taught him not to be ashamed of his scars. They told him that he's the same person inside but his skin is just a little different.

When Omarion returned home the Shriners came all the way from Cincinnati, Ohio to Ahoskie, NC to talk with all the children and adults at school about his situation. They told them about the garments he would wear and answered questions so that he wouldn't be bothered with a lot of questions.

Jesse Lu Sykes



My name is Jesse Lu Sykes, and I am currently 26 years-old. I was born prematurely on Sunday January 27, 1991 weighing in at one pound and 14 ounces. As my mom Donna wrote in a 2008 article for the Sudan Shriners Newspaper, two miracles happened the day I was born: the NY Giants won the Super bowl and I defied the odds of

survival since the medical staff caring for me believed I would not make it. Defying the odds has become a common theme of my life it seems.

Shortly after my birth I was diagnosed with cerebral palsy and received my first walker at the age of two. Since then, I have used a walker throughout my life. I was referred to Shriners Hospitals for Children by my school therapist at the age of eight and had many doctors' appointments until I was released at age 21. I received phenomenal care while I was a Shriners Kid - Botox muscle injections, new foot braces, physical therapy, x-rays and above all life changing surgeries. In 2007 the femur and tibia of my left leg and the tibia in my right leg were cut and rotated to correct my bone structure and improve my walking. I was in leg casts for six weeks and the finished results showed that my right leg was 100% straight and my left was 90% straight. In 2009 they operated again to remove the hardware from my first surgery and to finish straightening my left leg and the surgery was successful.

While all of this was happening, I was enrolled in Nash-Rocky Mount Early College. This rigorous program is five-years long and each student receives a high school diploma and a two-year degree upon graduation. Many did not think I would finish on time, however, I defied the odds set before me yet again. Not only did I finish on time, but I was the valedictorian of both my high school and community college classes. This achievement remains as one of my proudest accomplishments.

After graduation, I set off for college at UNC-Chapel Hill, more affectionately known as Carolina. I thought things would be okay since my mobility was much better and my mom was going to help me settle in. Sadly,

it did not work out as planned since my mother passed away on my first night at UNC. Due to this devastation, I was faced with staggering odds that I would not be able to finish what I had started but I persevered mainly because I knew that was what my mom would have wanted. I graduated with my bachelor's degree in psychology and the knowledge I could do anything I set my mind to. Near the end of college, I applied to graduate school at UNC and I proudly graduated from UNC in May 2017 with my Masters of Science degree.

When I visited Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC many years ago, there was a banner over the big fountain that read "Helping Kids Defy the Odds," and that is exactly what Shriners do. I cannot say thank you enough. Their care provided me with increased independence, confidence, and above all love while I was a Shriners Kid. I would not be where I am today without the Shriners and the good work that they do. Anything is possible. Shriners Kids can continue to defy the odds too as long as they never give up. I'm proof of that.





Marley Wiseman's Story



On June 9, 2017 Marley Wiseman got out of her wheelchair and walked across the stage to receive her diploma at First Flight High School in Nags Head, NC.

Marley & her twin sister Sydney, were born May 25, 1999 at King's Daughters Children's Hospital in Norfolk Virginia. Marley had 14 fractures from the delivery

and within a few hours she was diagnosed with Osteogenesis Imperfecta (OI-Brittle Bone Disease). At that time her prognosis was frightening to her family as they said she would probably never sit up, let alone walk.

Soon the family was referred to Sudan Shrine Center. Within weeks, Marley began 17 years of treatment at the Shriners Hospital for Children in Montreal, Canada that specializes in orthopedics and in particular the study of OI. Sudan arranged transportation, including several "Angel Flights" and provided lodging for Marley in Montreal. She had to go every four months to receive IV treatments to help increase the density of her bones.

Over 17 years Marley had 25 fractures. She has had many surgeries at Shriners Hospitals for Children in Montreal to insert rods in her legs, properly align her hips and eventually she had spinal fusion. During her long stays at the hospital theyz had a school teacher who arranged daily computer interaction with her classes in Nags Head.

The hospital also arranged for Marley to see a dental specialist who treated OI patients for soft teeth. Like most teenagers she is proud of her smile after her dental braces.

Summer 2017 she drove to work at an OBX surf shop in a car with adaptive controls and wheelchair lift. It is her cool car!

In September she started studying Professional Esthetics at the American Spirit Institute in Williamsburg, Virginia. In 2012 Marley was crowned Queen of the Shrine Bowl of the Carolinas but today is just an ordinary day for a very happy, grateful teenager, patient and friend to all Shriners.

SHRINE FUNDRAISING

Policies & Procedures Shrine Fundraising

INTRODUCTION

Because Shriners have been the driving force behind Shriners Hospitals for Children, it has become natural to associate the Fez with this charity. However, the Shrine of North America and Shriners Hospitals are separate and distinct legal corporations.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is incorporated in the state of Colorado, and it operates 22 hospitals. Its purpose is to provide medical care to children with disabilities without regard to race, creed, sect or nationality. This is the Charitable corporation.

The Shrine of North America is incorporated in the state of Iowa, and it presently has 195 unincorporated fraternal associations in Canada, Mexico, the United States and Republic of Panama. We know them as Shrine Temples. This is the Fraternal corporation.

A study done by Shriners International Headquarters found that Shrine Temples conduct more than 2,000 fundraising activities annually. Many of these fundraisers are strictly for the Temples – and this is perfectly acceptable. Other fundraising activities are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children – and this is also perfectly acceptable.

However, the individual purchasing a ticket, product, etc., or the donor, should be advised, in advance, how the proceeds will be used. This pamphlet is intended to provide guidance to the Temples, units, clubs and Nobles in their fundraising activities so there can be no criticism directed at them that the solicitation did not conform to the requirements of the law or was deceptive or misleading.

TYPES OF FUNDRAISERS

There are two types of Shrine fundraisers - Charitable and Fraternal

CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS - Where 100 percent of the net proceeds benefit Shriners Hospitals for Children.

FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS – Where the net proceeds benefit the Temple, which in turn may distribute them as it sees fit. For example, profits may be disbursed to the Temple general fund, a building fund, to clubs and/or units, to Shriners Hospitals for Children, to local community or Masonic related projects (DeMolay, Masonic Home, etc.) or any combination thereof.

PROCEDURES THAT APPLY TO ALL SHRINE FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

All fundraising must comply with the law of the land; that is, the law of the jurisdiction where the activity takes place. This includes national, state or province, and local laws.

The use of the name Shriners Hospitals is governed by §503.10 of the bylaws of Shriners Hospitals.

All fundraising is governed by General Orders as may be issued on that subject by the Imperial Potentate.

Insurance. Your attention is particularly called to that portion of the existing General Order #1 pertaining to insurance. Strict compliance is required. All contracts must be reviewed and approved by the Temple Potentate after receiving the advice of the Temple attorney.

All fundraising promotional materials (including Temple publications) must include a statement indicating the major entity benefited by the funds [Statement of Purpose].

STATEMENTS OF PURPOSE

All fundraising promotional materials must contain a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE. Below are examples for each type of fundraising activity.

FOR CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS:

"Net proceeds from this (activity, event, etc.) are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children."

FOR FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS:

"Net proceeds from this (activity, event, etc.) are for the benefit of XYZ Temple/Unit/Shrine Club."

DISCLOSURE (for Fraternal fundraisers) "Payments are not deductible as charitable contributions."

NOTE: All **fraternal** fundraising materials must include both the statement of purpose and disclosure.

CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS

It should be emphasized at this point that a Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), a Shrine Temple/club/unit, an organization of Nobles, or affiliated/appendant corporations SHALL NOT engage in any charitable fundraising effort other than for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When a decision is made to conduct a charitable fundraiser, the responsible Noble (club/unit president, committee chairman, etc...) must submit a written request to the Temple Potentate having jurisdiction thereof. If he approves, the Potentate must then obtain the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Trustees. This request shall be sent to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council, Shriners International Headquarters, P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, Florida 33631-3356. Final approval for a charitable fundraising activity is effective upon the Temple's receipt of a Charity Activity Form. If a request is denied by the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Temple Potentate will receive a full explanation in writing.

One hundred percent of the net proceeds from charitable fundraisers must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Expenses for operating the event must be actual, and no labor charges can be made for volunteer work by Shriners and/or their families

Under certain conditions, existing General Orders allow the use of a portion of funds raised for the hospitals to be used for patient transportation.

All solicitation materials, tickets, programs and documents must include factual information (Statement of Purpose) regarding use of the proceeds.

Information about our hospitals (obtainable from the Imperial Public Relations Department), such as patient success stories, facts and figures, photos or other appropriate material, may be used in programs for **charitable** fundraisers.

The Temple shall report the results of each charitable fundraising activity within 60 days of the activity to Shriners Hospitals for Children on the Charity Activity Form provided to the Temple. A Temple that fails to remit the net proceeds within 60 days of the activity shall be assessed interest retroactive to the date of the activity.

The Temple shall maintain detailed financial records of all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, organizations of Nobles or affiliated / appendant corporations for a period of seven years. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records.

State Solicitation Laws: Some states have solicitation laws that may require Shrine compliance. Temples must have their attorney review such laws. By way of example, the State of Florida requires that the following statement be included in all printed solicitation materials, receipts, written confirmation, or reminders of contributions soliciting charitable contributions for Shriners Hospitals. The statement must be conspicuously displayed in all capital letters.

SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN ARE DULY REGISTERED WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA AS REQUIRED BY ITS SOLICITATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS ACT. THEIR REGISTRATION NUMBER IS CH 433. A COPY OF THE OFFICIAL REGISTRATION AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION MAY BE OBTAINED FROM THE DIVISION OF CONSUMER SERVICES BY CALLING TOLL-FREE 1-800-435-7352 WITHIN THE STATE. REGISTRATION DOES NOT IMPLY ENDORSEMENT, APPROVAL OR RECOMMENDATION BY THE STATE.

FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS

A Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), or a Shrine Temple/club/unit, or an organization of Nobles or affiliated/appendant corporations must obtain the prior written consent of the Temple Potentate having jurisdiction thereof before engaging in any fundraising activity.

There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When the Potentate gives his written consent for a fraternal fundraising activity, a copy of the same shall be mailed to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council. Further, any printed materials pertaining to the fundraising activity shall be sent to Executive Vice President, Imperial Council if so requested.

All promotional material, tickets, programs and documents must contain a Statement of Purpose and Disclosure.

Information about our hospitals may be used in programs for fraternal fundraisers provided that each contains the appropriate Statement of Purpose and Disclosure.

This information must appear in conspicuous location used lettering bold enough to be easily read. Programs and other 'booklet' type materials must include the Statement of Purpose and Disclosure on the front cover or the first page. The Statement of Purpose and Disclosure should also be included as a part of each fundraising activity advertised in Temple publications.

The Temple shall maintain detailed financial records of all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, and organizations, of Nobles or affiliated/appendant corporations for a period of seven years. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records


