

Potentate's Message



It's hard to believe that I am writing the third message of the year and summer has already passed and the season of fall is upon us. The months have been busy for us all.

I want to thank all the units of Sudan who took their time to attend the Imperial parade held in Charlotte

the first week of July. This was the first time North Carolina has hosted an Imperial Session and we are honored to have as Imperial Potentate, Imperial Sir Alan W. Madsen, a member of our sister temple Oasis, and a resident of our great state. This is only the second time in the history of our fraternity that an Imperial Potentate has hailed from North Carolina, the first being in 1951 with our own Herbert Poteat, Past Grand Master of North Carolina and Past Potentate of Sudan Temple. Another Past Grand Master and Past Potentate of Sudan, Harvey W. Smith, was elected to the Imperial line in and would have served as Imperial Potentate in 1978 had he lived, however the black camel took him from us in 1976 as he served as Imperial Chief Rabban.

To all of our members and units who participated in the Fall Festival of SASA in Myrtle Beach - Sudan won the most trophies of the 18 temples that belong to the organization and we only had about 75% of our units to participate.

By now you should have received your dues notices for 2013. Please take time to remit these as soon as possible and if you have not paid your 2012 dues, please return these as well. We currently have over 300 members who have not paid their 2012 dues and the black camel continues to take our fellow nobles from us. Recently our deaths have averaged around 180 each year and with creation of new nobles being only between 100 to 150 we are declining in membership each year, even if we have no NPD's. However, with an average loss of 200 for nonpayment, our numbers are dropping at an alarming rate. Our current creations show that only about 2 percent of our nobility are actively recruiting new "quality" members. We need each of you to find men of good

character to help rebuild our fraternity. If only 5 percent of you would bring a candidate to Dunn for our Fall Ceremonial and if we could erase our NPD's by year's end our numbers could increase by 200 members. Can you imagine what we could do for our great fraternity if we would all do our part? We are not seeking quantity, we are after QUALITY. A chain is no stronger than its weakest link and our fraternity is no stronger than its weakest member. Masonry has taught us that "the greatest and best men of all ages have been promoters of our art", yet we can no longer claim that. We must return to finding quality men of good character to strengthen our fraternity. When we commit ourselves to this cause of quality first, the quantity will come and we will once again have the fraternity the Shriners were meant to be! I hope I can count on each of you to support this great endeavor.

RECORDER'S MESSAGE

Summer is behind us and I hope everyone had wonderful vacations. As we enter the last quarter of 2012, I know you will continue your support of Sudan and Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Update on our headquarters building: the concrete walkway that was damaged in order to repair a broken main water line has been repaired; a large section of loose flooring in the auditorium is fixed; all the windows on the river side of the building have received glazing, caulking and fresh paint outside and inside; larger downspouts have been installed in order to permit more rain water to be more rapidly removed from the roof; by the time of this Red Fez Magazine publication and mailing the dome should be in the process of repair and repainting or nearing completion.

This is an exciting time to be a Shriner and more especially a member of Sudan Shriners. Your temple continues as one of the premier temples in Shriners International. It is good to know that international interest in Shrine membership and The World's Greatest Philanthropy is on the rise.

At the 2012 Imperial Session in Charlotte, the first Imperial Session ever held in North Carolina, Oasis Past Potentate Al Madsen was installed as the Imperial Potentate. He is well qualified to preside at the helm and steer this wonderful fraternity and philanthropy into its future, and that qualification is enhanced by having at his side a wonderful lady, Jan, who is a fine leader in her own right. My lady, Laurie, and I have had the personal pleasure of knowing these two fine people since before Imperial Sir Al's election to the Imperial Divan and I can tell you, we have the right man in the right place at the right time. Because of Imperial Sir Al's leadership and work with qualifying Shriners Hospitals to receive insurance payments from those patients who are insured and who also wish to allow their medical insurance coverage to pay for treatment, our hospital system is in at least a little better financial shape. This is not to say we can relax our fundraising efforts, we cannot, but we are better than before insurance payments were received. I should also stress that all patients are still treated without requirement of payment for their medical treatments.

Also at the 2012 Imperial Session, Agila Shriners was admitted as the second temple in the Phillippines, and application has been received from Japan to establish a temple. This brings the total temples to 195. I encourage you



to read a short report about the Imperial Session printed elsewhere in this issue.

Please remain diligent about Sudan's membership development. We still have far too many NPD's and this has a negative effect on our budget. I ask each of you to review the list of NPD's on the entire temple list, not just your club or unit area, and make a personal contact with those on that list. Many times failure to pay one's dues is only an oversight. If you find a Noble in financial distress and who cannot pay his dues, please notify the Recorder's office or any member of the Divan as we have a process to remit his temple dues.

Membership is everyone's responsibility. You have heard it before, but membership really is the lifeblood of this fraternity and ultimately Shriners Hospitals for Children. Sudan currently sponsors about 600 patients. I know you join me in offering a special thanks to our Roadrunners Unit who continually transports children to and from our hospital system.

As usual, our units performed well at the South Atlantic Shrine Association, bringing home a number of awards. Please see that list of awards printed in this issue of the Red Fez Magazine.

You probably have or will soon hear more about our re-vamped Public Relations Operation. It has taken a few months, but with the efforts of our new Public Relations Director, Noble George Raecher, and others, a good PR Team has been put into place and is working to better inform the general public as well as our own members about what is happening in our temple, Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals. Almost all successful organizations have good public relations operations. Perhaps the most notable improvement thus far to most members is our enhanced Red Fez Magazine. This project alone is enough to keep anyone busy, so please adhere to deadlines which are usually printed on the back outside cover of each issue. Please don't hesitate to offer any suggestions for articles, photographs or improvements in our publications. But, our magazine is only one facet of our public relations operation; news releases and media conferences are on the planning block and we are sending special invitations to media outlets to attend ceremonial parades and formations, Moslem feasts, meet and interview Shriners and their families as well as Shriners Hospitals patients and families. The Shrine has a wonderful and important history and story to tell and we are planning to make it known.

50-Year Nobles Honored



Nobles Jimmy Ball of Mount Olive and Hugh Pate of Goldsboro, were recognized and honored for their fifty-years as a Sudan Shriner recently at the Wayne Shrine Club. The 50-Year Pin was accompanied by a Letter of Congratulation from the 2011-2012 Imperial Potentate Michael G. Severe. The pins and letters were presented to the nobles by Sudan Marshal, Carl Smith. Other Divan members present for the ceremony were Chief Rabban Ken Bennett; Oriental Guide, Cale Grady; Recorder, Benny Smith; Director, Frank Long and the 1st Ceremonial Master, Stacey Pugh. Noble Ball retired from the North Carolina Highway Patrol. Noble Pate is a retired businessman. Both Nobles crossed the "Hot Sands" in May 1962 while Illustrious Sir William A. Prince served as Sudan's Potentate.

The Oldest Sudan Uniform Parade Unit - SUDAN PATROL

Activity must be the keynote of success for any worthwhile organization. Even before Sudan was chartered, it was busily engaged in determining what units might be created for the stimulation of interest amongst the Nobility. In 1917, the Sudan Patrol was organized as the first Uniform Unit under Potentate Alexander B. Andrews, with Noble William T. Hill as the first Captain. It consisted of thirty-three members and in the early days performed many duties such as drills as well as the duties now absorbed by the Sudan Provost Guard and the initiation work for the second session. Presently, Noble Brian J. McDowell serves as the Captain. Noble McDowell takes a lot of pride in his selection as the Unit Captain as the unit leads off the Shrine Ceremonial Parades dressed in their seasonal Patrol colors. They march proudly with the flags of the countries representing Shrinedom in North America, as well as the Potentate's and Sudan Temple Flag. The Patrol presents the flag of our country prior to all formal General Membership meetings and performs at the annual incoming Potentate's ceremonial each January. Captain McDowell states "the unit once boasted a 50 plus membership with more waiting in the wings. The membership has dwindled some but the commitment still remains strong." He stated, "I remember well marching in my first parade in the 2007 May Ceremonial, in Goldsboro and couldn't have been prouder to wear the colors of the Sudan Patrol. I never would have enjoyed such an experience if it wasn't for the officers and Captain of the Patrol who mentored me along." Of the utmost importance, like with any other unit in Sudan it is "helping the kids".

Brunswick County Shriners Golf Tournament: \$575,000 for Shriners Hospitals for Children at the Quarter Century Mark and Still Going Strong.



Shallotte, NC: Early every August for nearly 25 years, Sudan Shriners, business people and golfers in Brunswick County, North Carolina have come together with a common goal – to raise money for the Shriners Hospital for Children in Greenville, SC. This year, a record 170 golfers participated, and the total raised was over \$40,000. Over the history of the tournament, this annual event has contributed a total of \$575,000 to the hospital. Twenty-nine youngsters from Brunswick County are patients and are receiving treatment at the Greenville, South Carolina Shriners Hospital for Children.

After spending the early years at Oak Island and Sea Trail Plantation, the tournament has been held at St. James Plantation in Southport for about twelve years. Volunteer Noble Don Hughes notes, “We really appreciate the support of St James management and staff. They are very accommodating and with three courses, this facility offers room to grow. Next year we plan to expand the tournament to two courses to speed up play for the increased field of golfers.”

Touchstone Energy electric cooperatives and the local co-op, Brunswick Electric, came on board in 2002 as a major sponsor, joining with about 75 local businesses to bring the event to even greater success. A core group of about 25 volunteers manage the entire event. The tournament has great support from the local business community and draws golfers from far and

wide. Longtime volunteer, Noble Glenn Humbert says, “We have lots of repeat golfers. People from other states actually plan their vacations around this tournament.” The tournament entry fee is \$175 per person and applications are sent out in May each year. “We start getting calls in April from players wanting to be sure they get their application in and reserve their spot,” Humbert continues.

The full weekend of activities kicks off Friday evening with a “Shrimp-a-roo” feast – all the shrimp, corn, sausage and potatoes you can eat. Breakfast and lunch are provided on Saturday and Sunday, with a full round of tournament play each day. Competition is fierce, with lots of friendly rivalry. This year, ladies had their own flight for the first time. On Sunday, the leader board is always crowded as people watch for final scores to be posted. The tournament wraps up with a buffet lunch and awarding of the trophies. Over the years, special fundraising ideas have included raffles, ball drops and more. This year, sponsoring businesses donated more than sixty prizes valued at over \$100 each for a raffle. The volunteer team sold 400 tickets at \$20 each, raising \$8,000 to add to the weekend total of \$40,000.

While there has not yet been a winner for the designated hole-in-one prize, local boat and car dealers have offered some pretty impressive prizes over the years.

This year, John Donaghue Automotive offered a choice of five cars, all lined up next to the Touchstone Energy Balloon in a colorful display. Chris Isgett of Hartsville, SC did hit a hole in one on # 16 at The Founders Club and won a new set of irons. But it’s not just about the golf. This tournament is like a family reunion, with the community, the businesses and the golfers all pulling together for a cause – “Shriners Hospitals for Children”. Yes, it’s about Shriners and their mission of providing innovative care for children and support for families during the acute and reconstructive phases of a child’s injury, regardless of the patient or families ability to pay. It’s about being there for your community.

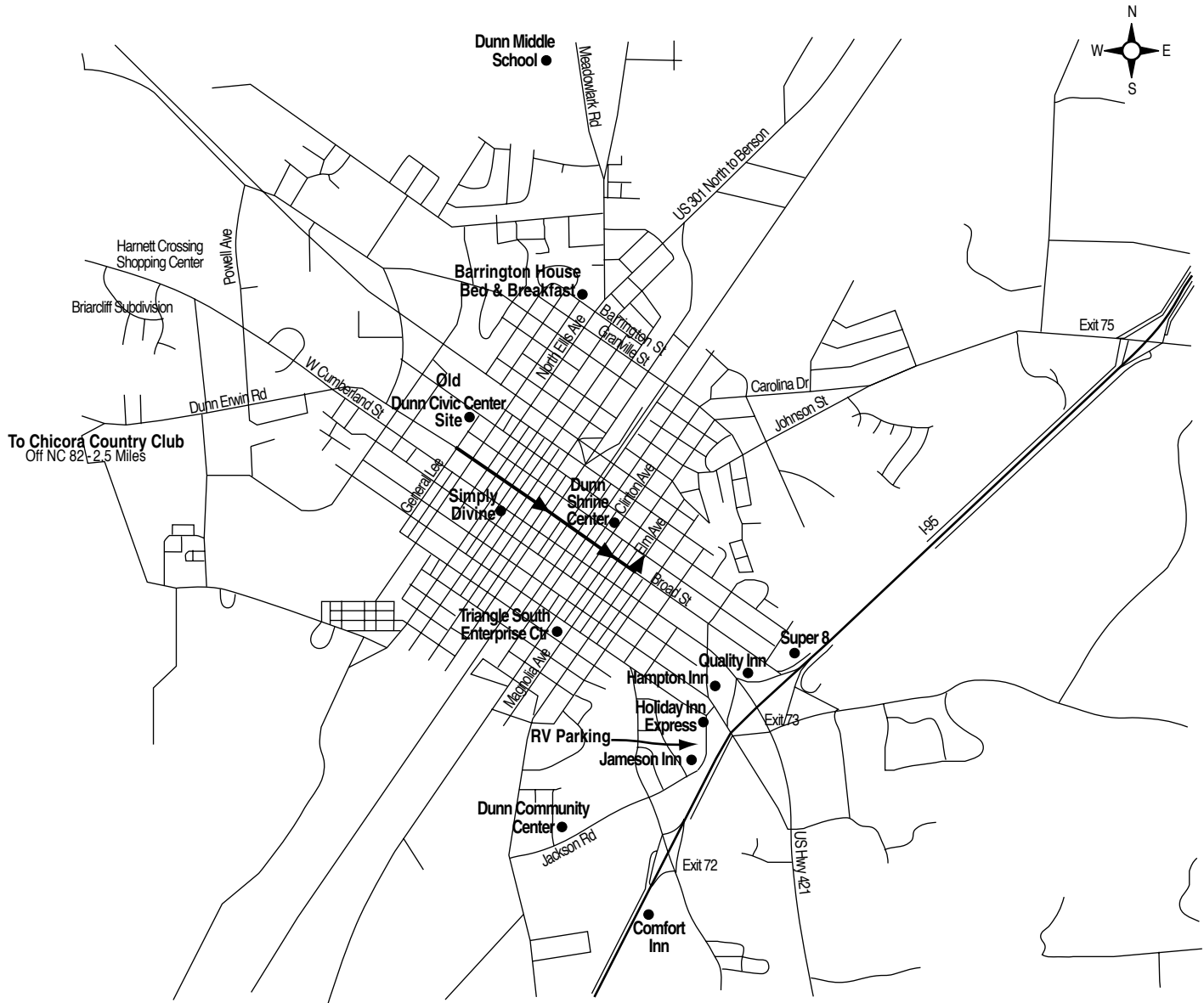

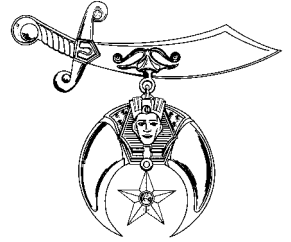

History of the Sudan Roadsters



The Sudan Roadsters is a parade unit, attached to the Sampson County Shrine Club Clinton, NC. The unit was formed in 1991; it was the brain storm of Noble Estel Simmons and the late Elwood Hall. Noble Mercer Johnson was responsible for getting everything approved through Sudan Temple to form the new unit. It was the consensus of everyone the unit be named the Sudan Roadsters due to the fact the cars were roadsters. Their first parade was a Shrine Parade in Lillington, NC. The Sudan Roadsters consisted of only one car at that time, which was purchased by Noble Estel Simmons. Noble Elwood Hall ordered the second car and more were to follow. At the present time the unit has 16 active cars, 5 recovery vehicles, with 20 active members and 2 life members.

The Roadsters are 1932 Ford Mini-Cars, which are manufactured by Sharp Mini Cars in Overland Park, Kansas. The cars are painted a bright yellow and are decalated with the Shrine logos. The recovery vehicles are golf carts painted to match the roadsters. The roadsters and recovery vehicles are purchased by individual members of the unit. Several roadsters have changed hands numerous times; all of the original cars are still in the unit. The first roadster came with a price-tag of about \$1,900.00, the newest roadster was purchased new in 2010 with a price tag of \$4,000.00. Each vehicle owner is responsible for maintenance and up keep of his own roadster and the trailer to transport it.

The Sudan Roadsters are very active in support of Sudan Shriners, attending most all ceremonials and SASA Conventions. The unit has participated in numerous SASA parades and has won First place six times (2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2007, and 2008). The Sudan Roadsters participate in approximately 25 Shrine and civic parades throughout the year. Each member is responsible for their own parade expenses; this can become very costly however the first child's smile makes it all worth it. All that the Sudan Roadsters do is in support of the greatest philanthropy in the world and most importantly the Shriners Hospital for Children.

New Bern Shrine Club Fish Fry

New Bern Shrine Club held its most recent and most successful fish fry to benefit Shriners Hospitals for Children on April 27th. While this event took place in April, the planning began in January. Cleve Woodard chaired the 45th annual event with the assistance of over 125 workers.

The activities on the day of the event began at 7:00 AM. As in years past, there were 4 different sites in New Bern where the fish consuming public could pick up a plate. The work and frantic pace continued until 8:00 PM. As the dust settled, New Bern Shrine Club had fried 4,000 pounds of trout, used 175 gallons of cooking oil and sold 4,750 plates of food.

There were two records set this year. One new record entailed the amount of time that it took to pack cole slaw the night before the event. A team of workers were able to pack 175 gallons of cole slaw into 5,400 cups in 70 minutes. That's over 77 cups packed per minute! And to my knowledge, no one pulled a muscle or injured themselves during that record setting pace.

As in years past, Treasurer Emeritus Bill Waters was able to secure a generous donation from the Bate Foundation to help offset some of the expenses. Noble Waters has provided this service for many years.

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of the New Bern Shriners and Shrinettes, and the generous assistance of the Bate Foundation, New Bern Shrine Club was able to donate \$31,340 to Shriners Hospital; a new record for New Bern Shrine Club.

Chairman Woodard said it best, "This is an event where all Shriners come together with one goal; working for the children. Regardless of the role, one person makes a difference."

I'm reminded of a quote from American writer Margaret Mead who once said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful people can change the world; indeed it's the only thing that ever has." As Shriners, through our hard work and dedication we are all changing the world, one child at a time.

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IMPERIAL SESSION REPORT

The 138th Annual Session of Shriners International was held in Charlotte, NC on July 1-5, 2012. Attending were your Representatives of both the Iowa Corp. (*Fraternity*) and Colorado Corp. (*Hospital*).

Ken Bennett - Chief Rabban

Also attending were Colorado (*Hospital*) Representatives:

There were a total of 808 Iowa Representatives registered to vote, and an additional 291 Colorado Representatives registered to vote.

Notes of Interest:

December 31, 2011 Membership totaled 309,894 which represent a loss of 15,356.

With the Charter Presentation to Agila Shriners in the Philippines, we now have 195 temples.

In International Development, Japan has applied for a shrine temple.

There were 22 Items in The Call for the Session. 5 Failed, 2 were Withdrawn, 2 were Tabled and 13 Passed.

Items of note that Passed:

Item # 3 – ARTICLE 11, 211.5 Per Capita Tax (d) – The per capita tax for the then current year will be neither collected from candidates initiated in November or December nor remitted to the Imperial Treasurer.

Item # 11 – ARTICLE 32, Initiation Fee; Dues; Hospital Levy; Assessments, 332.2 Dues.

No dues will be collected from candidates initiated in November or December for the then current year.

Item # 12 – ARTICLE 32, Initiation Fee; Dues; Hospital Levy; Assessments, 332.3 Hospital Levy.

A hospital levy will be neither collected from candidates initiated in November or December for the then current year nor remitted to the Imperial Treasurer.

****The combination of these three items means that a candidate initiated in November or December will only be charged an initiation fee for that year.****

Item # 14 - ARTICLE 36, Temple Units, 336.2 Public Exhibitions (a) (b)

(b) Civic Parades. In civic parades, Nobles, their ladies and children may participate, with the approval of the Potentate, so long as their ladies and children participate only as passengers in non-performing, non-competing vehicles with no less than four wheels.

****Each participation involving family participation in Civic Parades must have individual approval of the Potentate.****

Items of note that were Tabled:

Item # 7 – ARTICLE 23, Temple Membership, 323.8 Retention of Membership.

If this Item had passed, in the State of Arkansas, unless the Imperial Potentate's certification is withdrawn, or these bylaws are amended, candidates may be initiated even though they are not Freemasons. The Grand Master of Arkansas has suspended recognition of the Shrine in Arkansas, and had prohibited any Masons from participating in any Shrine activity (including transporting children to our hospitals) under penalty of expulsion. After futile attempts to settle this issue, **Imperial Potentate Mike Severe** had issued a Certification allowing Shriners to remain members in good standing in Arkansas. Obviously, this **Item was the most important one on the Call**, and there was a great deal of discussion, both Pro and Con. It was voted to Table this Item until our next Annual Session. Newly elected **Imperial Potentate Al Madsen** reissued the Certification allowing the Arkansas Shriners to remain members, but is meeting with the Grand Masters of Arkansas and Michigan to resolve these issues so that harmony will prevail. At this point, a great deal of progress has been made.

A Special Thanks to our own Grand Master, Robert (Bob) E. Gresham, Jr. for his involvement in reuniting our Fraternity.

Online Search

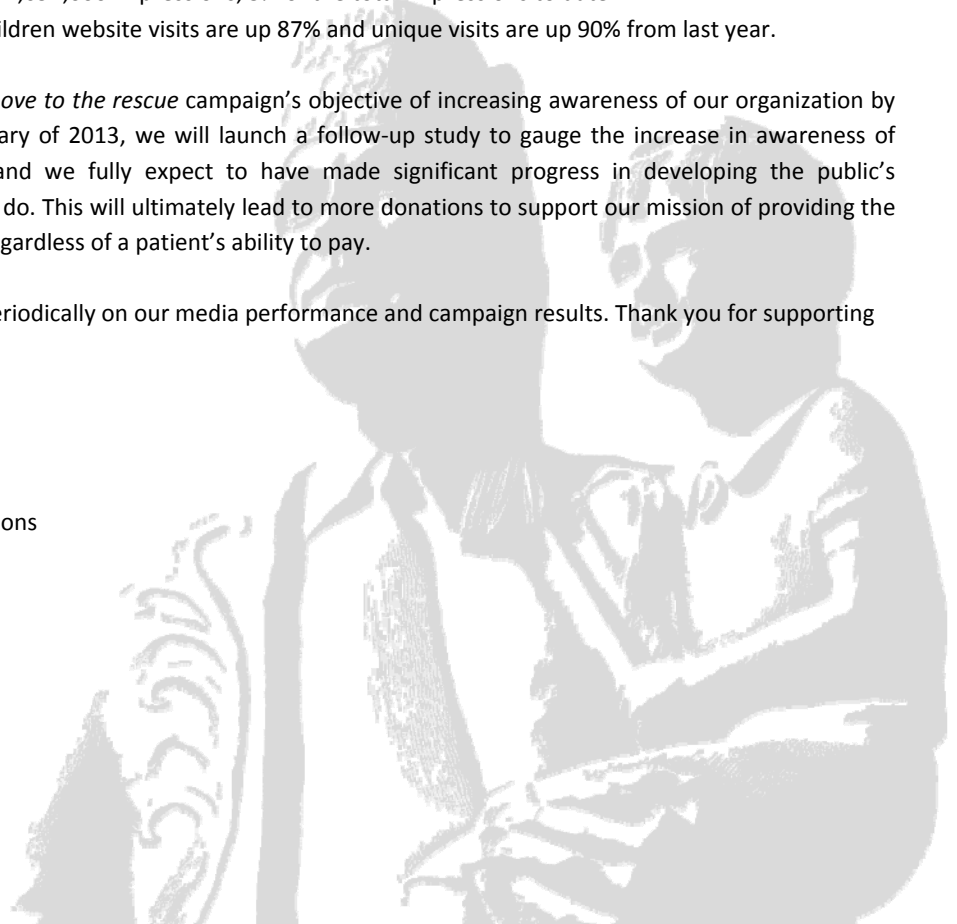
- Online search delivered 24,697,000 impressions, 5% of the total impressions to date

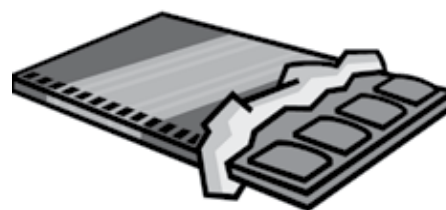

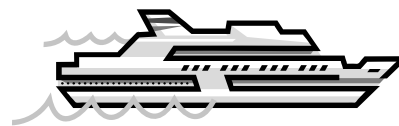

SHRINE FUNDRAISING

POLICIES & PROCEDURES SHRINE FUNDRAISING

INTRODUCTION

Because Shriners have been the driving force behind Shriners Hospitals for Children, it has become natural to associate the Fez with this charity. However, the Shrine of North America and Shriners Hospitals are separate and distinct legal corporations.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is incorporated in the state of Colorado, and it operates 22 hospitals. Its purpose is to provide medical care to children with disabilities without regard to race, creed, sect or nationality. The treatment for the children is provided at no cost. This is the Charitable corporation.

The Shrine of North America is incorporated in the state of Iowa, and it presently has 191 unincorporated fraternal associations in Canada, Mexico, the United States and Republic of Panama. We know them as Shrine Temples. This is the Fraternal corporation.

A study done by Shriners International Headquarters found that Shrine Temples conduct more than 2,000 fundraising activities annually. Many of these fundraisers are strictly for the Temples – and this is perfectly acceptable. Other fundraising activities are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children – and this is also perfectly acceptable.

However, the individual purchasing a ticket, product, etc., or the donor, should be advised, in advance, how the proceeds will be used. This pamphlet is intended to provide guidance to the Temples, units, clubs and Nobles in their fundraising activities so there can be no criticism directed at them that the solicitation did not conform to the requirements of the law or was deceptive or misleading.

TYPES OF FUNDRAISERS

There are two types of Shrine fundraisers – Charitable and Fraternal.

CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS – Where 100 percent of the net proceeds benefit Shriners Hospitals for Children.

FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS – Where the net proceeds benefit the Temple, which in turn may distribute them as it sees fit. For example, profits may be disbursed to the Temple general fund, a building fund, to clubs and/or units, to Shriners Hospitals for Children, to local community or Masonic related projects (DeMolay, Masonic Home, etc.) or any combination thereof.

PROCEDURES THAT APPLY TO ALL SHRINE FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES

All fundraising must comply with the law of the land; that is, the law of the jurisdiction where the activity takes place. This includes national, state or province, and local laws.

The use of the name Shriners Hospitals is governed by §503.10 of the bylaws of Shriners Hospitals.

All fundraising is governed by General Orders as may be issued on that subject by the Imperial Potentate.

Insurance. Your attention is particularly called to that portion of the existing General Order #1 pertaining to insurance. Strict compliance is required. All contracts must be reviewed and ap-

proved by the Temple Potentate after receiving the advice of the Temple attorney.

All fundraising promotional materials (including Temple publications) must include a statement indicating the major entity benefited by the funds [Statement of Purpose].

STATEMENTS OF PURPOSE

All fundraising promotional materials must contain a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE. Below are examples for each type of fundraising activity.

FOR CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS:

“Net proceeds from this (activity, event, etc.) are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.”

FOR FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS:

“Net proceeds from this (activity, event, etc.) are for the benefit of XYZ Temple/Unit/Shrine Club.”

DISCLOSURE (for Fraternal fundraisers) “Payments are not deductible as charitable contributions.”

NOTE: All fraternal fundraising materials must include both the statement of purpose and disclosure.

CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS

It should be emphasized at this point that a Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), a Shrine Temple/club/unit, an organization of Nobles, or affiliated/appendant corporations SHALL NOT engage in any charitable fundraising effort other than for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When a decision is made to conduct a charitable fundraiser, the responsible Noble (club/unit president, committee chairman, etc...) must submit a written request to the Temple Potentate having jurisdiction thereof. If he approves, the Potentate must then obtain the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Trustees. This request shall be sent to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council, Shriners International Headquarters, P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, Florida 33631-3356. Final approval for a charitable fundraising activity is effective upon the Temple's receipt of a Charity Activity Form. If a request is denied by the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Temple Potentate will receive a full explanation in writing.

One hundred percent of the net proceeds from charitable fundraisers must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Expenses for operating the event must be actual, and no labor charges can be made for volunteer work by Shriners and/or their families.

Under certain conditions, existing General Orders allow the use of a portion of funds raised for the hospitals to be used for patient transportation.

All solicitation materials, tickets, programs and documents must include factual information (Statement of Purpose) regarding use of the proceeds.

Information about our hospitals (obtainable from the Imperial Public Relations Department), such as patient success stories, facts and figures, photos or other appropriate material, may be used in programs for **charitable** fundraisers.

The Temple shall report the results of each charitable fundraising activity within 60 days of the activity to Shriners Hospitals for Children on the Charity Activity Form provided to the Temple. A Temple that fails to remit the net proceeds within 60 days of the activity shall be assessed interest retroactive to the

date of the activity.

The Temple shall maintain detailed financial records of all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, organizations of Nobles or affiliated / appendant corporations for a period of seven years. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records.

State Solicitation Laws: Some states have solicitation laws that may require Shrine compliance. Temples must have their attorney review such laws. By way of example, the State of Florida requires that the following statement be included in all printed solicitation materials, receipts, written confirmation, or reminders of contributions soliciting charitable contributions for Shriners Hospitals. The statement must be conspicuously displayed in all capital letters.

SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN ARE DULY REGISTERED WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA AS REQUIRED BY ITS SOLICITATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS ACT. THEIR REGISTRATION NUMBER IS CH 433. A COPY OF THE OFFICIAL REGISTRATION AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION MAY BE OBTAINED FROM THE DIVISION OF CONSUMER SERVICES BY CALLING TOLL-FREE 1-800-435-7352 WITHIN THE STATE. REGISTRATION DOES NOT IMPLY ENDORSEMENT, APPROVAL OR RECOMMENDATION BY THE STATE.

FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS

A Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), or a Shrine Temple/club/unit, or an organization of Nobles or affiliated/ appendant corporations must obtain the prior written consent of the Temple Potentate having jurisdiction thereof before engaging in any fundraising activity.

There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When the Potentate gives his written consent for a fraternal fundraising activity, a copy of the same shall be mailed to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council. Further, any printed materials pertaining to the fundraising activity shall be sent to Executive Vice President, Imperial Council if so requested.

All promotional material, tickets, programs and documents must contain a Statement of Purpose and Disclosure.

Information about our hospitals may be used in programs for fraternal fundraisers *provided that each contains the appropriate Statement of Purpose and Disclosure.*

This information must appear in conspicuous location used lettering bold enough to be easily read. Programs and other 'booklet' type materials must include the Statement of Purpose and Disclosure on the front cover or the first page. The Statement

of Purpose and Disclosure should also be included as a part of each fundraising activity advertised in Temple publications.

The Temple shall maintain detailed financial records of all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, and organizations of Nobles or affiliated/appendant corporations for a period of seven years. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records.
