This year there is a concerted effort being made to re-establish Sudan's Public Relations Operation. I urge you to re-

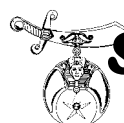

Being a Temple Director

Many nobles and ladies know Sudan Shriners Director Frank Long and his Lady Linda, but few know the duties and responsibilities of the Temple Director. Sudan's bylaws reveal the scope of the Director's position as follows:

Section 6: Director: The duties of the Director and the staff of assistants under his control, shall be to have charge of the decorations, paraphernalia of the temple, keep same in good order, make necessary preparations for Ceremonials and meetings of the temple, control all matters entrusted to him for preparation and performance by the Illustrious Potentate. He shall have direction of the work at the Ceremonial Sessions of the temple and provide for the proper reception and entertainment of novices and members and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him from time to time by the Illustrious Potentate. The Director shall also be in full charge of the Uniformed Units of the temple, and subject only to the direction of the Illustrious Potentate. Said Uniformed Units shall be organized at the discretion of the Illustrious Potentate, and not inconsistent with the Imperial Council Shrine Law. The duties of the Director, in no wise, modify the Potentate's responsibilities as Uniformed Units are under the control of the Potentate.

The Temple Director is an appointed position on the Divan of Sudan Shriners. The Director's position is also recognized by Shriners International and the Director as a voting member of the South Atlantic Shrine Association.

Following Temple Director, Noble Frank Long for a ceremonial weekend, reveals the real duties of the Director. A recent ceremonial in Nashville, NC found Noble Long in a Friday discussion with the hotel staff in how to set up for Saturday's events.

Dividing a large space to handle the incoming candidates and their preparation, determining the place for the First Section of the Initiation, a place for the Ceremonial Cast to dress, insuring that a place for the Second Section is available, obtaining adequate space for the Hospitality Suite and the flow of people for each is truly a logistics challenge. Preliminary plans may change based on the final number of candidates and space limitations. Ceremonial Friday is a busy day for the Director!

Parade preparation and scheduling is a different set of challenges. Has the parade route been finalized, secured and proper police co-operation obtained for the route and line-up area? Are parade units properly ordered to prevent overflow of music or noise interruptions? Are numbered cones properly placed to insure parade units have ample space in the lineup area? Has the reviewing stand/trailer been acquired and scheduled for delivery/setup? Have all unit members paid their dues? And let's not forget "those duties assigned by the Illustrious Potentate from time to time." And the list goes on and on.

Other Divan members and ladies help in event setup,

but the final responsibility lies with the successful working relationship between the Director and Potentate. It all sounds straightforward and simple until it is time for it all to manifest itself, hopefully with a smooth, hassle-free result for all Shriners and ladies attending. A few simple lines of duties and responsibilities, with a lot of commitment and dedication needed to handle the needs of the Sudan Shriners.

SUDAN FIRE BRIGADE



The Sudan Fire Brigade is the only unit of our Sudan units whereby all of the vehicles are owned by one individual. The unit was formed in 1980 by four former members of Sudan Temple Mini Cars. The group of Shriners were volunteer firemen in the community and wanted to do something special to recognize their fellow firemen. The miniature fire trucks were all owned by Noble John T. Pugh Sr. Noble Pugh was elected as "Chief" (Director) and remained "Chief" of the unit until his death in 1996. Noble John T. Pugh Jr. was then elected as the "Chief"/Director and remains in that position to this date. Noble Pugh is the owner of all of the 15 vehicles in the unit. He maintains and houses the vehicles in the same building that his father used. Noble Pugh states the vehicles require very little maintenance except for tires and routine tune-ups. The vehicles are transported to parades and events attended in his 24 foot enclosed trailer. The unit participates in approximately 12-15 Shrine and Civic parades each year. A special invite came in 1985 when the Fire Brigade was invited to the Governor James G. Martin's Parade in Raleigh. They have participated in numerous SASA parades and are recipients of ten (10) SASA Parade Awards which include four 1st Place trophies and six second place trophies for Best Parade Unit in the Fire Brigade category. The unit presently has fourteen members. The main attraction of the unit for parade attendees at a parade or event especially the children is the miniature (GI Joe) dressed as a fireman in the Boom Truck in the unit. The Sudan Fire Brigade has a strong commitment to continue support for the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Noble Leon Barnes Receives Special 60 Years Recognition



At the February 2012 meeting of the Robeson County Shrine Club, Illustrious Sir Steve Norris, Captain of the Guard, Buddy Brown and Outer Guard Coble Wilson III presented Noble Leon Barnes with a special "Team 2012" shirt. Ill. Sir recognized Noble Barnes and talked about how long they have been friends in the shrine and what an honor it was to recognize him as a being a Shriner for over 60 years. Noble Barnes crossed the Sands of Sudan on January 22, 1952. He has been very active in St. Albans Lodge #114 where he is a Past Master, a founding/charter member of the Sudan Tomcats, and Member of the Royal Order of Jesters. Noble Barnes stated what an honor it is to be a Shriner and a Mason for 60 years. He thanked all the Nobles and Ladies he had met through the years, and reminded us that we need to keep the children and our hospitals first.

The History & Story of the Sudan Desert Rats



The Sudan Desert Rats is a Shrine parade unit, headquartered at Pitt County Shrine Club in Greenville, NC. The first organizational meeting of the unit was held on August 28, 1997. The Illustrious Sir Lloyd Tyndall, Potentate of Sudan Shriners granted permission for the unit to form in September 1997. The Desert Rats started with 15 members and currently has 31. The unit has a "military" theme, with desert camouflage uniforms, black combat boots, and a maroon beret. In keeping with the military theme, our parade vehicles consist of 14 miniature "jeeps".

These jeeps were manufactured by Carter Brothers Manufacturing Company, Inc., Brundidge, Alabama, and were purchased by individual members in 1998. Several jeeps have changed hands over the years but all have remained in the Desert Rats Unit. All jeeps are painted tan & brown camouflage to match. Carter Brothers ceased manufacture of the "jeep" body in 2004 and the rest of the components a few years later. Unless a new Desert Rats member can locate & purchase one of these vehicles used, there are no more readily available. Our vehicles all have a distinctive, aggressive appearance. In addition to the miniature jeeps, we also have a gasoline powered golf cart, a Honda "Recon" ATV and

our newest addition, a Kawasaki Treyx4 utility vehicle, all in the tan & brown camouflage. These units are used as our lead and recovery vehicles in the event of a mechanical failure during a parade. All equipment is transported by a 2005 Freightliner diesel tractor (truck) with a 48 foot enclosed trailer, two 16 foot enclosed trailers and a 12 foot enclosed trailer, all of which are Unit owned.

The Desert Rats have had one main fundraiser every year since their inception; a reverse raffle that is held each February. With help and support from our fellow Shriners in Rocky Mount, we'll try a new fundraising event this October.

The Rats are a very active unit in our support of Sudan Shriners, attending most all ceremonies. We can always be found "tailgating" at SASA weekends and preparing & serving food to the Sudan Nobility at Spring Ceremonials in the past few years. The Rats participate in several Shrine & civic parades throughout the year. Any contributions we receive from civic parade participation are donated to the Shriners Hospitals for Children or the Sudan Transportation Fund. Many long hours and hard work by very dedicated members go to keeping and maintaining our equipment so that we can "play & entertain" kids of all ages. All that we do, from our "military" style camo uniforms to our miniature "jeeps", to participating in multiple parades around Eastern North Carolina & adjoining states, is to support the World's Greatest Philanthropy and most importantly "The Shriners Hospitals for Children".

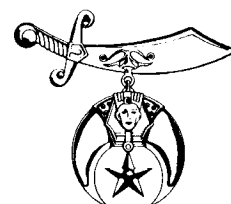

Be Burn Aware!

A Campaign to Reduce Burn Injuries

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is determined to decrease the number of preventable pediatric burn injuries by raising awareness. One program in this effort is the annual Burn Awareness campaign, which began more than 20 years ago.

During the first full week of February, our public relations efforts are dedicated to Burn Awareness Week, the kickoff of a yearlong educational campaign aimed at burn awareness and prevention, including offering free educational materials via our website. The items, including posters, activity books and fact sheets are designed to be a resource for firefighters, teachers, parents and others concerned with the safety and well-being of children, and are available in both English and Spanish.

We don't often think of it, but without some attention and awareness, our homes can be dangerous places, especially for our children. Homes are the sites of thousands of burn injuries to children every year, including scalds and fire-related injuries. Many of these incidents could have been easily prevented by following and implementing some basic safety tips.

"At Shriners Hospitals for Children, preventing burn injuries and providing burn awareness education is an on-going, yearlong effort," said Peter

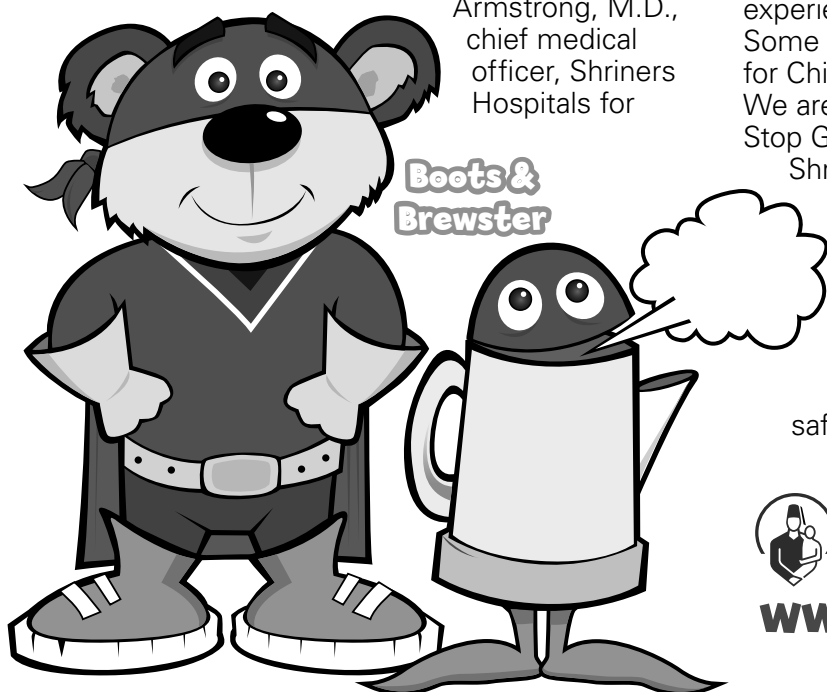
Children. "In 2012, our campaign, 'Be Burn Aware,' focuses on teaching children ways to avoid burn injuries at home."

The campaign introduces two new child-friendly characters who showcase and share our messages. Boots and Brewster – a caped, cuddly bear and a googly-eyed teapot – are featured in activity books for children ages 3-7 and 8-12. The engaging pair lead the children through the various rooms of a house, pointing out dangers, and how to easily correct or avoid them. The coloring pages, word searches, cartoons, and other activities are designed to grab the children's attention and present the information in a memorable, age-appropriate manner. The campaign also includes a poster of safety tips.

Previous years' efforts have emphasized prevention of gasoline and gasoline-related burn and scald injuries. All available materials can be viewed and ordered at **www.burnawareness.org**.

In 2012, Shriners Hospitals for Children will partner with other organizations also concerned with raising burn awareness. These relationships include sponsoring "Trial by Fire: Lives Re-forged," a documentary that emphasizes fire safety through sharing the personal stories of those who have experienced and overcome serious burn injuries. Some of the filming was done at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Boston, and features our patients. We are also working with Blitz USA, especially on its Stop Gas Fires campaign.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is also assisted in its burn prevention efforts by members of the Shriners fraternity. For example, during National Fire Prevention Week in October, members of Jerusalem Shriners partnered with both the local Home Depot and fire department for an awareness event, and the Wa Wa Shriners gave presentations on fire safety at area elementary schools.

"If I had a million dollars and I could go anywhere, I'd come here." – Jill Dender

"We always knew we would adopt a child," said Jill Dender. So, after her last biological child was born, Jill and her husband John began looking at adoption agencies. After a year and a half, their search ended and they adopted a little girl with special needs from China.

Hannah, with a severe cleft lip and palate, was given up for adoption when she was just five months old. She will never forget the words she heard next, "We can help you." After speaking with Mike White, the RN care coordinator at the Cincinnati hospital, Jill knew she had reached the right place and Hannah's condition would be treated.
