





Rusty & Bobbie Robbins



We started going to Shriners Hospital for Children at Greenville, SC in 2008. Rusty and Bobby were 10 years old.

Bobby had his first surgery on October 15, 2009 done by Dr. David's. He had to wear cast for 6 weeks on his legs with no weight bearing. He had to go for cast stretching every week. This was terrifying to him. He was scared of the little saw blade. When his cast was removed he had to be admitted for inpatient physical therapy. Bobby was scared again. He did not want to put weight on

his legs it was a funny feeling to him. Mainly we think it was a mind thing.

Bobby had his second surgery on July 30, 2013 done by Dr. Westberry. Dr. Westberry put rods and screws in his legs and ankles. He did not have to have cast this time. He had to wear knee immobilizers on his legs for 6 weeks with no weight bearing. After the 6 weeks he was admitted for inpatient therapy for a week.

Bobby had his third surgery on February 5, 2015 done by Dr. Westberry. This surgery was to remove his hardware that was placed in 2013. He got to keep the rods and screws that were removed.

Bobby continued to see Dr. Westberry yearly from 2014-2018. During his last visit with Dr. Westberry on January 22, 2018 he was told that he had aged out of Shriner's. Dr. Westberry told Bobby he was doing a good job and to keep up the good work. He also told him to stay active and not gain weight cause his ankles are weak and will not be able to hold up the weight.

Rusty was seen a couple of times at Shriner's. Rusty is not ambulatory so Shriner's could not do any surgeries for him. They did do x-rays and braces for his legs for a while.

We would like to thank Shriner's hospitals for Children for all they did for Bobby and Rusty. If Bobby had not gone to Shriner's we don't know how he would be today. Before he went there he walked with a crouch. They said he probably would have gone backwards and ended up in a wheelchair.

Thank you Dr. David's and Dr. Westberry for everything you did. Thank you to all the nurses and staff and everyone made us feel welcome. Thank you to all the Shriners who help children.

Thank you to Donna Horton for all your help through the years.

Ashley Brown



Ashley was born in 2012 and she crawled/walked later than other children with difficulty even though she tried not to let it slow her down. She was active in soccer and she loves to draw. In 2009-2010, after multiple doctor visits she visited the Shriners Hospital in Greenville, SC. Dr. Westbury and his team were wonderful! After several tests, exams, and a complete work-up they determined she had di-ple-

gic cerebral palsy. From 2010-2015 Ashley underwent several treatment options including braces, botox injections, night splints, etc. Nevertheless, surgery was decided in the end; due to the increased pain Ashley was suffering from and her diagnosis had been upgraded to tri-plegic cerebral palsy. In December 2015, Ashley was admitted into the Shriner hospital for a week to undergo surgery on both legs. She had to wear a cast on both legs for about 1 ½ months. She then upgraded to braces and with the help of a walker and then canes could walk. All through the process she remained upbeat and happy. In December 2016 she once again had to undergo surgery to remove the plates in her right leg. Ashley is now a freshman at West Craven High School in Vanceboro, NC and you can never tell by looking at her all that she has gone through. We would like thank the Shriners, the road runners, the doctors, and all of the other helpers that have helped us with the process of getting Ashley to the point she is at now! THANK YOU!



Linwood Tyler Jones





Noble Linwood Tyler Jones history with the Sudan Shriners dates back to 1996 when he was born with polysyndactyly. Polysyndactyly was in his hands and feet where two fingers on each hand were webbed together by skin and webbing on my toes.

"I do not remember the exact circumstances but I do remember the stories that I have been told by my family. My time with the Shriners and the Shriners Hospital in Greenville South Carolina began with my sponsorship by my Grandfather Doug Furgason and a several other men. After my surgery I remember the years that followed where I would go once a year to the hospital for a checkup as I continued to grow. I was thinking about having another surgery to fix my feet but found no reason to because it did not limit me in any way. When I reached the age of nine years old I quit receiving the yearly checkups because everything seemed to be going well with no complications. I can't thank the people enough that helped me because they have made my life a little easier and I feel that there is no way in this world I could ever repay them. I do remember at a young age participating in the annual Shriners parade in New Bern riding on the Shriners child float with the other shrine patients."

"In 2017, I joined the world's greatest fraternities. In July of 2017, I became a Master Mason in Zion AF & AM, Masonic Lodge #81. Now that I have accomplished that, I want to be where it all began so that I can give and help just as many before had done for me. There is a person in my life that I will always remember and never forget. My grandfather Doug Furgason is a man of extraordinary honor, character, and integrity. Without him I don't know how I would ever have come to such noble honors that I have come to with being part of this great brotherhood. He is true to the Society of Friends and brothers. I hope and wish to carry on his great and powerful legacy that has played a tremendous role in my life."

"I have spent all my life growing up in Jones County where most of my family has been settled. I started AFJROTC my freshman year and finished my senior as Cadet Major Squadron commander of the high school. During my junior year of high school I joined the volunteer fire service at Comfort Rural Volunteer Fire and EMS Department. During my time of service there, I have been Safety officer. I am an active fire member and now Captain of EMS being the head officer of the department at Comfort Emergency Medical Service. I also serve at Trenton

EMS where I am also Captain. I am currently employed at Bosch in New Bern and am also attending Craven Community College working on an Associate's Degree in Manufacturing Technology. I plan to attend East Carolina when I complete my Associate at Craven Community College. My journey has been easy compared to many patients."

Noble Linwood Tyler Jones has expressed his gratitude to those that have made a difference in his life. He is a "go-getter" in all that he does. On January 27, 2018 he made that special step into Shrinedom and by all indications is going to excel, wear his Fez with pride and dignity.

Accident Survivor Becomes Sudan Noble



A story was published in the April 2003 Sudan Red Fez magaA zine whereby a young man by the name of Bryan Nobles was paralyzed when he broke his neck in a swimming accident. The accident happened in September 2002 when Bryan was 15 years old while he was swimming with friends. His friends pulled him from the water and saved his life. By the nature of

his initial injuries he could have been a quadriplegic for the rest of his life. He was treated first at Pitt Memorial Hospital in Greenville, NC. He was placed on a ventilator and lost a lot of weight.

Subsequently, he was sponsored as a shrine patient by Past Potentate Stacey Pugh and shortly thereafter airlifted in an air ambulance to the Shriners Hospitals for Children - Philadelphia. He returned to the SHC's on two separate occasions after the initial visit for tendon transfers and rehab as well. As the initial article read, Bryan surprised everyone with how he made others feel. He talked about his accident, how it happened and the treatment he had received. As his caregivers at the hospital described, "he was a very mature young man, many in his condition would have given up and settle in a life of being a quadriplegic, but not Bryan."

Noble Bryan graduated from New Bern High School on time and then attended Craven Community College in New Bern receiving a two-year degree in Mechanical Engineering. He then attended North Carolina State in Raleigh and graduated in 2006 with a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering. In 2010, he started working at Marine Corps Air Station, Cherry Point working with various types of military aircraft mechanical engineering issues. He and his wife, the former Denise Priesing, have been married for 5 years and have two beautiful daughters, a two-year old and a 5 month old. Bryan's mom, Jennifer, has played a big role in his life and has nothing but praise for our hospitals and Bryan's treatment and care.


