

Recorder's Message

plans are being considered for our 100th year celebration.

I hope you join in this year's activities as our Potentate, Illustrious Sir Ken Bennett, and First Lady Juanita execute their plans for fun, fellowship and service to the "World's Greatest Philanthropy". The Spring Ceremonial will be held the first weekend in May rather than the traditional weekend due to conflicts with obtaining adequate hotel rooms in New Bern. I should bring to your attention a matter concerning our patient transportation vans. We have one van that is a 2003 model wheelchair lift van with over 160,000 miles on it which continues more than its share of problems; two other vans have in excess of 180,000 miles. We must replace these three vans as soon as possible. The Potentate and I appeal to all Clubs and Units and individuals to consider donations to this cause. At its January meeting, the Board of Directors authorized replacement of the fire escape steps on the back of our headquarters building. Those steps have been there since 1956 and exposure to the elements has taken a severe toll and they must be replaced.

NOTE B--AFFILIATED ORGANIZATION

The Sudan Shriners is affiliated through common membership with the Widows Fund. The two organizations share common facilities at their Broad Street, New Bern location. The Widows Fund pays rent of \$3,000 per year to the Sudan Shriners.

NOTE D--DONATED SERVICES, MATERIALS, AND FACILITIES

The Sudan Widows Fund receives services from a variety of unpaid volunteers. No amounts have been recognized in the accompanying statement of activities because the criteria for recognition of such volunteer effort under SFAS No. 116 have not been satisfied.

NOTE E--CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

Sudan Widows Fund maintains cash and investments at banks and other financial institutions that are FDIC insured. At December 31, 2012 balances did not exceed FDIC insured limits. At December 31, 2011 balances exceeded FDIC insured limits by \$17,603.

NOTE F--SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

SUDAN PROWLERS



The Sudan Prowlers were formed in 1998 in Rocky Mount, NC. The unit was formed under the direction of Past Potentate Bruce Bulluck and 2nd Ceremonial Master Carl Smith. The unit started with approximately 20 charter members of which seven are still active today. The Prowlers took the name tailoring it as the Plymouth Prowler. The original miniature vehicles were purple in color and purchased and maintained by the individual unit members. They maintained this status until 2005 when they sold their vehicles. The new vehicles were purchased as a Sudan Prowler Unit and those were colored yellow with purple striping. They now have 12 miniature cars and two recovery vehicles. This Sudan Parade unit participates in approximately 10 -15 parades/events a year. The unit is funded by two fraternal reverse drawings a year, one in February and one in October. This is the fifteenth year of the unit's existence and is being led by Captain Robert Hitt with Scott Medlin as Lieutenant. If you have ever attended a Sudan Ceremonial you will have seen the Prowlers and their ladies heavy into cooking, whether it be chili or burgers and hot dogs, with all the fixings. They are serious about sharing that fellowship and brotherly love with any of the Nobility who would like to participate.

Sudan Horse Patrol's 50Th Year

At the May Ceremonial in 1963 held in Dunn, the Sudan Horse Patrol rode in its first Sudan parade. They rode with six horses with leather saddles. The riders were Capt. Carl B. Renfro, Lt. Joe I. Joyner, Sgt. H. K. Smith, Sect.-Treas. Emmitt Matthews, Paul Jones and Tommy Tucker. T. Bruce Boyette was the other member. Carl B. Renfro furnished the horses for the unit until 1969 when the members started purchasing their own horses.

From this humble beginning, the Horse Patrol has become one of the most active units in Sudan (In 1963 – Sudan had 6793 members). They have never missed a Sudan Ceremonial Parade. The unit has taken a leadership role in Sudan with the following serving as Potentates: Illustrious Sirs T. Bruce Boyette (1966), Cecil T. Boyette (1983), Arnold Lee Brown (1992), and Joe I. Joyner (2001). Noble Marshall Brock has served as the Director of Units.

In 1974, they attended the first SASA in Myrtle Beach and have not missed a SASA event in spite of floods and hurricanes. That same year, they rode in their first Cherry Blossom Parade in Washington, DC and have attended this parade on numerous occasions.

Throughout the years, they have won first place in competition for mounted units in over 90% of the parades in which they have participated.

They have been to SESA (Southeastern Shrine Association) in Birmingham, New Orleans, Louisville, Savannah, Memphis and Greenville, SC.

Their first appearance at the Imperial Session was in the 1970's in Washington and Atlanta and since 1982 they have not missed an Imperial Session and have ridden in most of them on their own horses. They have also rented and borrowed horses as they travel across the county. The Sudan Horse Patrol has been a member of International Shriners Horse Patrol (ISHP) since 1974. Through the years, they have displayed a strong and effective leadership role in the ISHP. Nobles Ralph Ellis, Ron Haines (also a member of Lulu Shriners) and Allen Harper have all served as the President. Noble Bill Stuckey is currently the 5th Vice President.

The Sudan Horse Patrol hails from Wilson, North Carolina and is looking forward to another 50 years.

Noble Abe Elmore Completes SHC Board of Governor Duties



Noble Abe Elmore is someone that every Shriner should aspire to be. Abe Elmore towers over people, perhaps not in his physical stature, but rather in his service to mankind. Noble Elmore was born and lives in Dunn, North Carolina.

Abe was raised in the Blue Lodge in 1958 and was created as a Sudan Shriner in May 1963. Abe has been very active in his

50 years as a Shriner. He spent 27 years in the Flag Unit and eight years as the Sudan Membership Chairman. He was on the Board of Trustees for ten years and in December 2012, he finished his ninth and final year as a member of the Board of Governors of the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC. Nine years is the maximum allowed on the Board of Governors and since he served all nine years, he will now serve as an Emeritus Member. The SHC Board of Governors takes time and dedication. They meet each month in Greenville and the members serve on multiple committees. This service requires traveling to Greenville on Sunday, meeting all day on Monday, and then traveling back home, all at the nobles own expense. Counting his six months as an apprentice member, Abe was in attendance at 97 monthly meetings, driving over 56,000 roundtrip miles!

Abe says the decision for Shriners Hospitals to accept third party payment from insurance has been the biggest challenge during his tenure. "That decision has set the hospitals on a much better financial course to continue to offer expert care. It's a change of mindset and Shriners have to know that those types of decisions are made so that we can always help the children and

we never turn a child away, regardless of their ability to pay," noted Abe. At a recent meeting, Noble Elmore told the story of a young girl he observed walking across a local shopping center parking lot. The child had a very obvious limp and was struggling to walk. Being a Shriner, Abe approached the child's mother, introduced himself and gave her a card with the Shriners Hospitals for Children phone number and telling her he thought the Shriners could help her

daughter. At this point, the child spoke up and said, "I'm already a patient there, look how good I can walk." In fact the child was a patient of Shriners Hospitals and was very proud that she could now walk. Of course the mother of the child was very thankful for the continued care they receive at Shriners Hospital.

Abe is a successful business man in Dunn where he owns several local furniture stores. In addition to his business and Shrine duties, he has found time to be on the Board of Directors of Betsy Johnson Hospital in Dunn, serving multiple years as Chairman of that board. Abe has been on the Board of Directors of the Baptist Children's Home of North Carolina for 38 years. He has 54 years of perfect attendance at the Kiwanis Club and has been the Chairman of the Dunn Christmas Parade for 42 years. Abe was also the mayor of Dunn, NC for 16 years.

Abe and his wife Jackie, along with others, started a church in Dunn in 1964. Abe is a Deacon at Westfield Baptist Church where he and Jackie are the last attending founding members. He has been married to wife Jackie for 59 years who has always supported his many endeavors. They have four children, ten grandchildren, and nine great grandchildren.

When asked what he would like his legacy to be, Abe simply stated that he tried to always remain positive and to keep the mission of Shriners Hospitals for Children. He stated that he was most proud of being part of an institution that gave the best care in the world for the children that we serve. Noble Abe Elmore has certainly given much in his life to his family, his community, his church, his fellow Nobles and the scores of children that the Shriners serve. He has made a mark on mankind, and he's not finished yet.

Sudan Convertibles History



The year was 1984 and the Potentate Illustrious Sir Willis Brown, following his years on the Divan, felt strongly that a consistently dignified and impressive manner was needed to transport the Sudan Officers and Divan in Ceremonial and other Shrine parades. After much consideration and consultation Illustrious Sir Willis Brown asked Noble Mercer Johnson to form a unit, whose primary purpose would be to transport Sudan Officers and Divan in all Shrine parades, but could also represent Sudan in non-Shrine parades.

It was decided that convertible automobiles with back seats would provide a somewhat more formal method of transportation than many might expect from the usual fun loving units in Shrine parades. Noble Mercer was able to form a group that would parade for the first time in the 1984 Spring Ceremonial in Fayetteville, NC and included Mustang, Oldsmobile and Cadillac convertibles. Nobles Bill Autry, Martin V.B. Davis, Cecil L. Fisher, Sr., Mercer Johnson, Alvin Kornegay, J.T. Manning, Jr. and Billy Tripp were among the charter members of Sudan Convertibles. For his help, guidance and support Illustrious Sir Willis Brown was made an honorary member of the Sudan Convertibles and to this day remains the only honorary member of the unit. Upon becoming inactive in the 1990's Noble Mercer Johnson was made a lifetime member in grateful appreciation for his efforts and perseverance in forming the unit, serving as Unit Director for its first two years and giving valuable counsel in the years that followed.

If any readers know of Sudan Convertibles charter members not named here, please advise the Sudan office and they will get the information to the unit to be included in our permanent records. Over the years, in addition to Sudan Ceremonial parades, the Sudan Convertibles have participated in all of the South Atlantic Shrine Association parades, Tampa, Baltimore, Pigeon Forge, and Charlotte Imperial Shrine parades. Second place in the 2012 SASA parade is the latest among the many awards Sudan Convertibles Unit has received.

When the unit was formed, it became obvious that our members would come from all parts of Sudan's footprint therefore it would not be practical for Sudan Convertibles to maintain a "home base" at any one of the many fine shrine clubs in Sudan's jurisdiction. That being the situation, permission was granted allowing Sudan Convertibles to maintain a permanent awards/picture case in the lower lever of Sudan Temple. In 2012 a custom made addition to our awards/picture case was dedicated to the late Noble "Bunk" Mizell, who was our much loved and longest serving Unit Director.

The Unit Director now is Noble Charles "Skeeter" Trott from Southport. Presently there are 25 members and they meet on Saturday morning preceding Sudan Ceremonial parades The vehicles are all individually owned, maintained and the expenses of traveling to these many ceremonials are incurred by the Nobles themselves. Rest assured the Sudan Convertibles are not forgotten for the pageantry they have provided over the years.

Shriners Hospitals for Children Reaffirms Commitment to Burn Prevention through Annual Campaign

(Tampa, Fla) Feb 3-9, 2013 is Burn Awareness Week, and during this week Shriners Hospitals for Children will begin its annual burn prevention campaign. This year's focus is on teaching children to "Be Burn Aware" especially at home. The effort will include materials for children, as well as both general awareness and scald prevention information for parents and other concerned adults. Scald injuries are one of the most prevalent, and preventable, types of burn injuries occurring in the home. Information and materials pertaining to the effort can be found on the health care systems website dedicated to burn awareness and prevention. www.burnawareness.org Homes are the sites of thousands of burn injuries every year, including scalds and fire related injuries. Many of these incidents could have been easily prevented by following and implementing some basic safety tips.

The campaign again uses two popular and child-friendly characters to showcase and share our messages: Boots and Brewster – a caped, cuddly bear and googly-eyed teapot in the materials. In the materials, the pair leads children through the various rooms of a house, pointing to dangers, and how to easily correct or avoid them.

"Shriners Hospitals for Children is committed to improving the lives of children", said Richard Kagan, MD., Chief of Staff, Shriners Hospitals for Children – Cincinnati and member of the physician executive team. "Many burn injuries that occur in the home are easily preventable; we hope that our ongoing awareness and prevention campaign will reduce the incidence of these injuries." Previous years efforts have emphasized prevention of gasoline and gasoline burn and scald injuries.

Retreat Transforms Lives

"I always thought that I was the only one with burn scars. I never saw anyone else like me in my school or anywhere I went," laments a young teenaged girl who is a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Cincinnati. "I felt alone and insecure. Since everyone told me I was ugly, I believed that it was true." That was before she attended the **Angel Faces Retreat** last summer in California. "From then on (after Angel Faces) I felt more confident about how I looked. The change was huge... I started seeing myself as a beautiful young lady instead of that ugly little child."

Angel Faces Retreat was founded by Lesia Cartelli in 2003 to transform the lives of adolescent girls with severe, permanent facial burns and disfigurements. Lesia herself was burned over more than 50% of her body in a natural gas explosion when she was nine. She knew what it was like to grow up with burns on her face and decided to create a retreat for other young girls with facial burns and teach them the tools that it took her 20 years to discover. The annual retreat is located in Cordova, California, about two and one-half hours north of San Diego. Over the course of the week, the girls attend sessions to learn about positive methods to respond to stares, teasing, bullying, unwanted questions and coping with uncomfortable situations. Therapeutic touch using facials, massage, hair and makeup lessons are also some of the activities the girls participate in, along with daily journaling and exercise. The attendees work in group settings to tell their stories, role play, and work together to learn how to answer and react to the uncomfortable stares and questions.

Adriana Ramirez is another Cincinnati patient who benefitted from attending an Angel Faces Retreat. She was burned in a hot oil fryer accident when she was 16 months old and was severely burned on her face, scalp, neck, chest and back. She learned about the retreat from Cincinnati employee Tracy Gaboury OTR/L, a licensed occupational therapist at the hospital. "Before I arrived at the retreat, I was very nervous. After I arrived, all that changed. I felt a sense of belonging as I walked through those doors. By the end of the first three hours, the whole group had bonded and become very close," Adriana said.

"This is a retreat, not a camp. This retreat focuses on situations what we girls face every day: Stares, teasing and questions. The girls focus on helping each other through the pain. We find our way how to answer questions and respond," she said. Before she went to the retreat, Adriana said that she really didn't like herself and avoided looking at herself. Adriana's parents also noticed a big change when she returned from the retreat. "Oh she was so interested in makeup and hair all the time," said her mother. "She had so much more confidence and smiled all of the time." "When I came back, everything was just different. Everything happens for a reason. Before, I never looked into the mirror, and now when I look in a mirror, I see the beauty that is there." Ongoing contact with the people from Angel Faces Retreat remains long after the girls return home. The girls and counselors use Skype once a month to continue learning and bonding. "When I need an energy boost or need help, I can call or text Lesia and she's there."




