I am humbled by your ongoing confidence and trust, and will continue to work as hard as I can to ensure a strong future for our beloved philanthropy, especially as it approaches its second hundred years of service to patients and families.

As we have stressed for some time now, today approximately 85% of pediatric medical procedures in the U.S. are performed in an outpatient setting. It is imperative that we understand that we do not have unlimited resources, and need to use what we have – including beds and buildings – wisely and judiciously, throughout our health care system.

This Imperial year, we will continue to work to align our health care system with the needs and expectations of the health care industry, our patients and families and prospective patient families. Specifically, this means we will continue reviewing and restructuring each location as appropriate, including working on plans for Boston and Spokane and evaluating the situations in several other sites, including Salt Lake City, Springfield, Shreveport and Greenville.

An important piece of legislation that was passed at Imperial Session will make it easier to make decisions and implement needed changes in a more timely and effective manner. A change in the bylaws regarding hospital governance makes it possible to relocate existing hospitals with a two-thirds vote of the combined Joint Boards and the Board of Governors of the facility in question. This can now be done at any time throughout the year, which gives us needed flexibility to plan

for and respond to situations as they occur, rather than waiting for the next Imperial Session to make a decision. We have already seen the beginning of benefits of this legislation. Just last week there was a historic vote involving the Joint Boards and the Boards of Governors of the Houston and Galveston hospitals that will allow the Houston hospital to relocate within the Galveston facility.

The joint board members, executive leadership and hospital board members will continue to work tirelessly to strengthen, protect and preserve our philanthropy. Our decisions will be guided and determined by what is best for our patients and what will allow Shriners Hospitals to provide our unique brand of life-changing health care to more kids in more places for many years to come.

Thank you again for your confidence and trust in me, and for all you do for your fraternity and philanthropy.

## Shrine Hospital Patients - Now A New Shrine Family



Jory and my Shriner's journey are very much alike! From the time frame, the hospitals, the temple and even the doctor we saw (which happened to be the same one!). I'll begin with my journey. The noble who had recommended the hospital to my dad was my dentist. I was a patient at Shands in Gainesville for my hip dysplasia and leg length discrepancy. I remember going to Shaddai Temple and taking photos of my

back and leg lengths. We were told they would be contacting the Shriners Hospital in Tampa immediately. My mom, dad and I went to Tampa to what we thought would be a routine outpatient visit. Dr. Grogan conducted the evaluation and asked my parents about a birthmark I have on my cervical spine area. That was the day I had my very first MRI, concentrating on that very birthmark. I have spinal stenosis and a vertebra was attached to my spinal cord causing it to split in two. I was sent to Tampa General to get checked in for surgery, where we met Dr. Gene Balis. He performed my surgery at Tampa General because the Shriners Hospital was not set up to do my kind of surgery. I was then sent to Shriners Hospitals for Children in Tampa for recovery. After 33 years, I can close my eyes and remember the paint on the walls, the smell of the outdoors where you could see the lake, and the fun times we all had as patients...even though we were in the hospital. I was in the middle wing called "Seashells" where they had 4 patients per room. Four girls in one room...four boys in another. There were "Beachcombers", "Seashells" & "Sandcastles" I do believe. They did not allow patients to simply stay in bed to recover or to even eat meals. There was a place called "The Mall" where we gathered for activities and our meals. Many times we rode the van down to our doctor appointments. I continued outpatient services until aging out at 20 years old.

Jory was put into the Shrine program by Lt. Michael B. Odom from the Panama City Beach Police Department. He was a member of Shaddai Shrine Temple in Panama City, FL. They went for his outpatient appointment when he was 10 or 11 years old (1985-86). It was supposed to be a routine outpatient visit. Dr. Grogan decided to do surgery immediately. He had two extra-navicular bones on both ankles. He

remained in the hospital for about 5 or 6 days. Dr. Grogan told him before he could go home; he had to walk around the track. Jory was so determined to go home, he did it on crutches! He was a part of the bone research that was just beginning in Tampa.

Our memories of the hospital are very much alike as we had the same doctor and some of the same physical therapists. We were childhood friends and became very close friends in middle school. We lost touch over the years and reconnected about 15 years ago. We began talking about eight years ago and are now a happily married couple. Our missions in life are to give back to the Shriners Hospitals for Children. Jory had always wanted to become a noble and I will be right there by his side to support him and the Shriners Hospitals for Children. We are grateful for the care we received as children and one day, we hope to go back and visit the Tampa hospital where we received such wonderful and loving care. Hopefully we will get to thank Dr. Grogan and Dr. Gene Balis in person. Never ever give up; you can make your dream a reality! Jory is a firefighter/EMT. If it wasn't for Shriners Hospital for Children, I probably would not be walking right now. NOTE: This article was provided by Noble Jory Blumer and Lady Allison. They joined our Sudan Shrine family on May 5, 2018 in Morehead City. Noble Blumer is a member of Hope Mills Shrine Club and the Sudan Convertibles. Both are very active working for the shrine club and Shriners Hospitals for Children. Evidence of their continued dedication, is this year when they attended and participated in the "Walk for Love" at the July 2019 Imperial Session in Nashville. They told us that there was not much that they could do until she was older. This is when things began to look up! A lady I knew asked

We made the 5 ½ hour trip to the Greenville Shriners' Hospital for Children in South Carolina. Everyone was so welcoming from the gentlemen at the front desk to all the doctors and nurses. Dr. Heir and her team began assessments and promised "they would not give up on my Jayda." That was good enough for me. Through the team's hard work, we were able to get OT, PT and speech therapy back home in NC. Jayda has had two surgeries and is able to move her hands, kick her legs out, push forward and backward with her feet, and roll over. These things would not be possible if we had not been blessed with the care Shriners Hospitals for Children provides. We have met other children that prior to coming to Shriners were told that they would never walk and yet now they walk and run. In 2018 Garrett was diagnosed with scoliosis and pectus excavatum and on July 1, 2019 he had the surgical Nuss Procedure at the Shriners Hospital for Children in Springfield, Massachusetts. 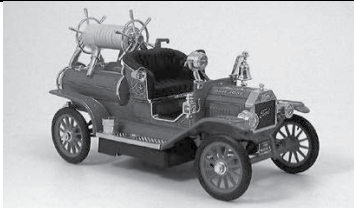
In 2015, when Maurice Rivenbark became president of the Pender County Shrine Club, his wife Joyce, felt a need to get to know the other ladies in the club. She approached the vice president's wife, Darlene Peay and the secretary's wife, Donna Anderson to help brainstorm how this could become a reality. During the year, they met several times to socialize and become better acquainted. They called themselves the Pender County Shrine Ladies. Toward the end of the year, the ladies decided they wanted a way to better support their husbands' efforts for Shriners Hospitals for Children - Greenville. They called the hospital and spoke with personnel who told the ladies the hospital needed pillow cases, draw sheets, and sent a list of small items used in speech therapy, physical therapy, etc. The group decided they would make pillow cases and draw sheets to be sent and collect the small items. The first year all the material was donated for the pillow cases by Shriners' wives and the ladies were able to deliver approximately 100 pillow cases and 30 draw sheets to the hospital along with other small items requested. The following year, the ladies added a bake sale to the Shriners Fish Fry to raise money for material. In 2017, the ladies wanted to expand, so they developed a basket raffle in conjunction with one of their nobles' events. By word of mouth, people in the community heard about the Pender County Shrine Ladies group and the pillow case project and people began donating material from estates and storage to supplement the material purchased by the fundraising. Each year the hospital is contacted to ask about their needs. Pillow cases, draw sheets, pillows, and small items are delivered in late November or early December. This year the ladies should be able to deliver approximately 400 completed pillow cases in a variety of child friendly patterns for both boys and girls.

## This Is My Moment:

### The stories of Cristian and Madelyn

*Every year, Shriners Hospitals for Children® selects two National Patient Ambassadors to represent the health care system's patients. The ambassadors spend the year sharing their stories of perseverance in the face of adversity and the ways Shriners Hospitals for Children has made a dramatic difference in their lives. Introducing our two new Ambassadors:*

#### Cristian

Cristian, who is now 18, was born with spina bifida and hydrocephalus. In his first two weeks of life, Cristian had two surgeries and went on to have nearly a dozen more. Cristian faced several of the same challenges of many other patients with spina bifida, including gastro-intestinal system and balance difficulties, as well as complications from various surgeries.

For several years, Cristian's family had difficulty finding doctors who understood how to best help him. That all changed one day in 2012, when Cristian met a Shriner who referred him to Shriners Hospitals for Children. Cristian was 13 when he had the surgery that he says changed his life and gave him hope, at Shriners Hospitals for Children — Los Angeles (now Shriners for Children Medical Center in Pasadena, California).

Devoted to his schoolwork and seminary studies as well as his part-time job and playing the cello, Cristian has also been active in supporting Shriners Hospitals for Children. He even dedicated his Eagle Scout project to the cause, raising funds to present more than 200 Build-A-Bear toys to the Pasadena medical center.

Cristian is looking forward to his responsibilities as a National Patient Ambassador. "I know that I am who I am because of the Shriners," he said. "I have been able to see that I can do whatever I want and I can overcome any obstacle that I face. I want to give back to them because of that — because of the life that they've given me. Through Shriners Hospitals for Children and the national ambassadorship that I've been given, I hope to share a message of positivity and hope to all those who need it."



#### Madelyn

Madelyn, now 19, was born 10 weeks early. Doctors told her parents that she was beautiful, healthy, tiny — and was born without her left arm.

Madelyn's journey with Shriners Hospitals for Children began with her first visit to our St. Louis location, when she was just 3 months old. Throughout her childhood, Madelyn used prosthetics,

mainly for balance, and to help with various activities. Occupational therapists at the hospital helped Madelyn learn to function and interact in the world. As she grew older, Madelyn began using her prosthetics less often, and by middle school, she opted to stop using them.

In school, Madelyn's busy schedule included not only her classwork but also competitive swimming, first on a team for children with disabilities, then on her high school team. She also participated in competitive, coed water polo. "Nothing is impossible in my mind," she said. "It's just the ability to adapt and work around it."

Madelyn has always devoted herself to advocating and educating. She loves to make YouTube videos showing how to accomplish things using only one arm. At Ability Awareness Week, a program of St. Louis area elementary schools, Madelyn loves to share her story and to explain how Shriners Hospitals for Children changed her life. Drawing from her own experiences of being bullied for having only one arm, Madelyn likes to incorporate anti-bullying themes into her presentations.

Madelyn is currently a student at Maryville University in St. Louis, where she is very active in student activities, and made the Dean's List her first two semesters.



*"I am incredibly excited to see where this year takes me,"*

*Madelyn said. "I hope to inspire other kids, and be able to show them that they can do anything they put their mind to — they might just do it a little bit differently."*
